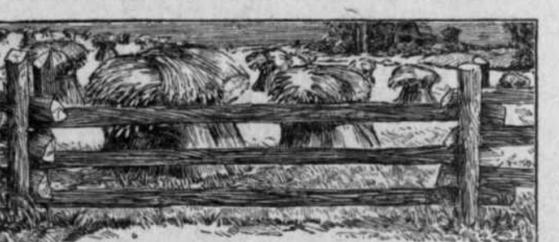

CHARTER OF MORBIHAN SUGAR CO., Inc.

Be It Known, That on the 9th day of the month of June, in the year of our Lord One Thousand Nine Hundred and Twenty, before me, J. A. Gonsoulin, Clerk of Court and Ex-Officio Notary Public, in and for the Parish of Iberia, State of Louisiana, duly commissioned and qualified, and in the presence of the witnesses hereinafter named and undersigned,

Personally Came and Appeared, Alphonse A. Theriot, Ernest R. Theriot, Henry N. Pharr, Porteus R. Burke, Richard A. Snow, appearing through A. A. Theriot, duly authorized, J. Emile Verret appearing through A. A. Theriot duly authorized, Eugene A. Pharr appearing through H. N. Pharr duly authorized and Jno. A. Pharr acting through H. N. Pharr duly authorized who declared and said that, desiring to avail themselves of the provisions of the laws of Louisiana with reference to the organization of corporations, they do hereby form themselves, and such other persons as may hereafter become associated with them into a corporation and body politic for the objects and purposes and under the articles following, to-wit:

Article I. The name and title of this corporation shall be the MORBIHAN SUGAR COMPANY, Incorporated, and under its said corporate name, it shall have the power and authority to contract, to sue and be sued, to make and use a corporate seal and same to break and alter at pleasure, to acquire by purchase or otherwise, hold, receive, purchase, alienate, improve, sell, borrow on, pledge, mortgage and hypothecate under its corporate name property real, personal and mixed, to name and appoint such officers, directors, agents and managers or employees as may be desirable, to prescribe their duties and to fix their compensation if any, to make by-laws, rules and regulations or the management of its affairs, to conduct business in this State and other States, territories and countries, to hold stock in other corporations, and to do all things necessary proper, and desirable to carry out the objects and purposes of this corporation. Unless sooner dissolved, under the provisions of this Charter, the said corporation shall exist and continue for a period of fifty years.

Article II. The domicile of the said corporation shall be in the City of New Iberia, in the Parish of Iberia, State of Louisiana. The President, or in his absence, the Vice-President or in the absence of both the above officers, the Secretary of this corporation shall be the person upon whom citation or other legal process may be served.

Article III. The objects and purposes for which this corporation is organized and the nature of the business to be engaged in by it are hereby declared to be to own and operate a sugar mill or refinery or factory or more than one and the buying, or otherwise, acquiring or leasing of such mill, or refinery or more than one such, together with such lands, equipments and appurtenances as may be deemed necessary, and also the buying, acquiring or leasing, planting and cultivating of farm lands, the buying, selling, or otherwise, disposing of all and every kind of crop or crops, grown and raised on farm and agricultural lands, the advancing of money, funds and supplies on growing crops, to construct, maintain and operate tramways, railways and other roads and means of transportation necessary for the conveyance and transportation of raw and manufactured products and generally, to do all things necessary to the raising, growing, cultivating, of crops, buying, selling and lending money on products and the handling of all agricultural products and the acquiring of lands and the disposing of same and the establishing and operating of sugar mills, factories, and refineries and to engage in the buying and selling of sugar as well as all stores and mercantile establishments.

Article IV. The capital stock of said corporation shall be Three Hundred and Fifty (\$350,000.00) Thousand Dollars, divided into and represented by Three Thousand Five Hundred (3500) shares of the par value of One Hundred Dollars each, which stock shall be paid for in cash at the time of issuance, or it may be issued at not less than par, in payment or in exchange for property or right actually received or purchased by said corporation or it may be paid for by promissory notes of fairly solvent parties equivalent to cash and accepted by said board at such equivalent, and at not less than par value of said stock, or for such other valuable considerations or service actually rendered as the Board of Directors of said corporation may determine, provided that no stock shall be issued until the consideration therefor has been received by said corporation, and it being the intent that the greater part of the capital stock of this corporation shall be issued for property to be given and exchanged therefor, there is attached and annexed hereto and to be read in connection herewith, an accurate and detailed and itemized description of such property so taken as to its amount, location, extent, character and state of improvement together with a statement of its value as appraised by the Directors of said corporation, the said statement to be deposited, filed and recorded in the office of the Clerk of Court of Iberia Parish, Louisiana. Every sale or transfer of the capital stock of the corporation shall be made on the books of the company at its office and on the surrender of the certificate therefor, a new certificate shall issue to the proper holder thereof.
