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**Chamber of Commerce
Holds Interesting Meet.**

The open meeting of the Chamber of Commerce last Tuesday night was attended by the following citizens: Messrs. Leon J. Landry, Cyrus L. DeBlanc, President H. W. Carver, Arnold E. Frick, Leon J. Minvielle, Harvey Hill, C. A. Barnes, Paul Bassin, John R. Taylor, El Elias, Dr. W. C. Gosling, R. W. Frame, Dr. W. F. Carstens, Geo. Gabriel, R. S. Pesson, L. L. Bertrand, George J. Cousin, Julius N. Bertrand, Fredy Armentor, L. G. Williams, Silvio Broussard and others.

The meeting was called to order by the President and a report read by Secretary Noel. One of the first things discussed was the Parish wide road tax called by the Police Jury to be held on August 31st. It was the sentiment of all present that no better or forward step could have been taken by the Police Jury and the members were not only complimented but upon motion of Dr. Gosling, Messrs. A. Davis, John R. Taylor, L. L. Bertrand, L. J. Minvielle, Ed. L. Estorge, John Schwing, C. L. Provost and Fritz Dietlein were delegated to appear at the next meeting and tender the services of the Chamber to assist in carrying the election.

A general discussion over the importance of cleaning out the Commercial and Coulee Rodere Canals, so as to get commercial advantages, as well as more efficient drainage for the farm lands adjacent to Coulee Rodiere. Mr. Silvio Broussard was the principal spokesman and he advised that a committee be appointed to secure the necessary data. On motion, duly carried Messrs. Broussard, S. O. Nuckolis, R. S. Pesson, Dr. W. F. Carstens and W. J. Burke were appointed to look into the feasibility of connecting the two canals.

Mr. Luke L. Bertrand then asked that literature be supplied Messrs. Broussard and Decuir, the two young men that will make the Farm Boys tour through the West so that they could advertise the resources of the Parish. On motion a committee was appointed with Mr. Bertrand as chairman. It was then that Mr. Arnold E. Frick extended an invitation to the members to make an inspection of the New Iberia Canning Company's factory. The invitation was accepted and the board requested to visit the factory on Thursday morning.

Several other matters were discussed by the President and Secretary, but for certain reasons the press was asked to withhold publication until a more opportune time.

THE BAND CONCERT.

The Chamber of Commerce brass band made the welkin fairly ring last Wednesday night when a large number of auditors accorded the musical organization a real demonstration of applause. The boys were in fine fettle and they played with a vigor that was most surprising.

COAL SHORTAGE GETTING SERIOUS.

The coal situation is beginning to get very serious in this country, and unless the prevailing strikes at the coal mines are called off, many New Iberians may run short as the railroads are confiscating cars for their own use and there is no recourse. We reproduce below a letter addressed to Mr. Max Levy which is self-explanatory:

"I have before me your favor of the 28th, advising your car has been confiscated by the Y. & M. Railroad. We naturally regret this very much, as we do not know when it will be possible for us to replace same. We shall cut the ar out of your account, billing against the railroad, and you may destroy invoice.

At the present time, as you possibly know, we have a strike on at our Illinois mine as well as Alabama mine. So long as this condition prevails, we nor anyone else will be able to deliver coal on commercial orders. This for the reason that all of the railroads in the Southeast are depending entirely upon Kentucky for their fuel requirements, and this naturally will more than take care of the entire production. Just as soon as this condition is over I will be pleased to take up with you with a view of supplying your needs. You might place your order with us at this time for what coal you feel you will require to be shipped out of our Kentucky mine and we will undertake to place order at the very best we can do at the prevailing price at time of shipment. This is the only thing we can do for you just at the present time."
