

TAXING SMALL ACCOUNTS

Lafayette banks have notified their small depositors that in future it will be necessary to make a normal charge in the nature of a service fee for carrying accounts that show less than a \$50 daily or \$100 monthly average balance.

Banks, next to postoffices, are our greatest and most serviceable public utility, and have been operated largely on the free public service basis that features the postal service.

Unfortunately banks do not have an Uncle Sam to make up their deficits in operating expenses. Hence, the policy, established for years as a part of the metropolitan banking system, of making a nominal charge for handling the accounts of depositors whose daily balances do not make their accounts an asset to the bank.

It is well worth the fifty cents service fee to have a bank account and the checking conveniences in transacting one's daily business. This applies as well to the very small depositors as to the average one. Paying one's bills by check is an efficiency method appreciated more and more as one becomes accustomed to and enjoys the conveniences.

When one considers the fact that a large percentage of depositors' accounts are those not regarded as assets to a bank because they are so small, and are accepted merely as an accommodation to the customer, one can realize the proportionate share in the overhead expense of a banking institution that the small account bears to the volume of business of the bank.

Banking is a science. Its resources are based on scientific principles of financing. Its overhead expenses are not estimated, but proven in their application to each account. One banking official recently showed us the actual cost of handling each account, including bookkeeping, salaries and other necessary items.
