A newspaper is not duty bound to print anything that it doesn't want to print. There is no rule that requires it to print something of absolutely no news value just because somebody wants it printed.

The mission of a newspaper is to print news of general interest. Advertising is not news. Something concerning a single individual is not news.

True it is that a newspaper gives away much, especially where charity is concerned, but it does not follow that the publisher should adopt charity as an established custom and open the door freely to all comers.

ACT OF INCORPORATION

"The Toggery," Incorporated

State of Louisiana, Parish of Iberia. Be it known that on this 19th day of November in the year of our Lord, One Thousand Nine Hundred and Twenty One, before me, C. Arthur Provost, a Notary Public in and for the Parish and State aforesaid, duly commissioned and qualified as such, and in the presence of the witnesses hereinafter named and undesignated, personally came and appeared the persons whose names are hereunto subscribed, but of whom Henry Broussard and Octave J. Villere are represented by Donald R. Mestayer, by virtue of a Power of Attorney, a certified copy of which is herewith annexed and made part hereof, who declared that availing themselves of the laws of this State, relative to the organization of corporations and particularly Act No. 267 of the General Assembly of the State of Louisiana for the session of 1914, they have consented and agreed and do by these presents, covenant and agree to bind, form and constitute themselves as well as each other persons who may hereafter join or become associated with them into a corporation and body politic in law, for the objects and purposes, and under the agreements and stipulations following, to-wit:

ARTICLE I.

The name and title of this corporation shall be "THE TOGGERY," INCORPORATED, and as such shall enjoy all the rights and privileges granted by law to corporations, and their term of its existence shall be for a period of Twenty-Nine (29) years.

ARTICLE II.

The domicile of said corporation shall be in the City of New Iberia, Parish of Iberia, State of Louisiana, and all officers and all legal process shall be served upon the President and in his absence upon the Secretary-Treasurer of said corporation.

ARTICLE III.

The capital and amount of the authorized stock of this corporation shall be as follows: To-wit: One Hundred (100) shares, of the par value of One Hundred (\$100.00) Dollars each, divided into One Hundred (100) shares, par value One Hundred (\$100.00) Dollars each provided, however, that the subscription of Fifty (50 p. c.) per cent of said stock shall be sufficient to charter said corporation; and said stock shall be paid for in cash and may be issued for property actually acquired for by said corporation.

pledge property, both real and personal; to borrow money and issue bonds, notes and other obligations; to have and employ such officers, directors, managers, agents, and other employees as the interest of said corporation may require and to establish such by-laws, rules and regulations for the proper management and control of its affairs as may be necessary and expedient.

ARTICLE IV.

The amount of capital stock of this corporation is hereby fixed at the sum of Ten Thousand (\$10,000.00) Dollars, divided into One Hundred (100) shares, par value One Hundred (\$100.00) Dollars each provided, however, that the subscription of Fifty (50 p. c.) per cent of said stock shall be sufficient to charter said corporation; and said stock shall be paid for in cash and may be issued for property actually acquired for by said corporation.

ARTICLE V.

It is agreed upon becoming a stockholder of this corporation that in the event said stockholder wishes dispose of his stock, he must first offer it to the existing stockholders of this corporation for a period of Thirty (30) days before disposing of it to outside parties.

ARTICLE VI.

Each stockholder shall be entitled, in person or by proxy, to cast one vote for each share of stock owned by him.

ARTICLE VII.

No stockholder of this corporation shall ever be liable for the contract or faults of the corporation in any further sum than the amount of the unpaid balance due on his stock; or shall any informality in organization have the effect of rendering this charter null or of exposing a stockholder to any liability beyond the amount due on his stock.

ARTICLE VIII.

All the corporate powers of this corporation, and the management and control of its affairs shall be vested in and exercised by the Board of Directors composed of three (3) stockholders, a majority of whom shall constitute a quorum in the transaction of business.

The Directors of the said corporation shall be elected annually at a meeting of the stockholders to be held on the Second Monday of May each year at the domicile of the Corporation, and notice of said stockholders meeting for the election of directors must be given to each stockholder at least fifteen (15) days before the day of such meeting by depositing said notice in the Post Office properly addressed to each stockholder; such notices to be signed by the Secretary.

ARTICLE IX.

All vacancies on the Board of Directors of said Corporation shall be filled by election by a majority vote of the other members of the Board of Directors for the unexpired term.

ARTICLE X.

The office of President-Manager and Secretary-Treasurer or all of them may be held by the same person provided said person be a stockholder at the time of said election and shall hold at the time not less than one share of unpledged stock in said corporation; the Board of Directors to appoint or elect said officers.

ARTICLE XI.

The Board of Directors to manage the business and affairs of this corporation from date of incorporation qualified is declared to be as follows:

Henry Broussard, New Orleans, La., who shall be President-Manager; Donald R. Mestayer, New Orleans, La., who shall be Secretary-Treasurer and Octave J. Villere, New Orleans, La., who shall be Vice-President.

ARTICLE XII.

The failure to elect Directors on the Second Monday of May annually, shall not dissolve the corporate or impair its management, but the then existing directors and officers shall hold over until the next annual election, except as otherwise provided herein.

ARTICLE XIII.

The Board of Directors shall have the power to adopt, establish, amend and alter such by-laws, rules and regulations as it may deem necessary for the proper conduct and management of the business of the corporation. It may appoint all such officers, agents, or employees as may be necessary and shall have power to define and fix the duty of said officers or employees, who shall hold office and employment at the pleasure of the board.

ARTICLE XIV.

Whenever this corporation shall be dissolved, either by limitation or otherwise, its affairs shall be liquidated by two commissioners to be appointed by the stockholders at a meeting called for that purpose. Said Commissioners shall remain in office until the affairs of said corporation shall have been fully liquidated, and in the event of the death of one of said Commissioners, the survivor shall complete the liquidation.

ARTICLE XV.

The names and post office addresses of the subscribers of these articles of incorporation and a statement of the number of shares which each agrees to take, and the marital status of each of said incorporators appear by the signatures of said subscribers.
