CALL FOR VOLUNTEERS.

The President of the United States will probably issue another call for troops from Louisiana and Southwest, under the provisions of the bill authorizing the enlistment of ten thousand additional volunteers to serve in the war against Spain. It is my wish, therefore, to organize a regiment to be composed largely of former cadets of the Louisiana State University, and to be known as "The Louisiana Cadets."

It is believed that such a regiment, organized in Baton Rouge and encamped and drill on the University grounds until ready for duty in the field, would be in excellent condition for effective service in the Cuban campaign; while the experience of the officers of the University in looking after the health, comfort and general welfare of cadets, would tend to mitigate, for this regiment, the hardship of service in the field and the sickness incident thereto. In war, sickness is more to be dreaded than being killed, and is more deadly than the bullet.

Those who intend to respond to the President and who wish to enlist with the cadets of the Louisiana State University, are earnestly requested to send me their names at once. Volunteers will be received, between ages of eighteen and forty-five; but applicants under twenty-one years of age will not be accepted without the consent of their parents or guardians. In the event that any whole company offers its services, every effort will be made to secure recognition by the war department of the company organization.

Sons of the veterans who followed Beauregard and the Johnstons, Jackson and Lee, come and sustain the glorious record of the Louisiana soldier! Here at this great State and National military school, we have been trained for just such national emergencies as this. Our great country calls us; let us not be found wanting.
