

Death of Mrs. Rudolf Teutsch.

After a period of declining health of over a year, concluding with several months of great suffering, Mrs. Rudolf Teutsch died Wednesday morning, May 6, at 6:30 o'clock. Though surrounded with every comfort and attention that the love and devotion of her husband and other relatives could give, medical science suggest or wealth could furnish, the end was not to be delayed. She has passed away beyond the sound of human weeping, beyond the out-reaching of human love.

Mrs. Teutsch was born Justine Mayer at Schweighausen, Alsace, Germany, 48 years and 9 months ago. She had resided in the United States most of her life, and in St. Francisville. She was first the wife of A. Teutsch, a prominent merchant of this place. After some years of widowhood she became the wife of her late husband's cousin, Rudolf Teutsch, another member of the family who had chosen America for his home, standing high in the esteem of his fellow-citizens. In both instances, Mrs. Teutsch was happily married, and though she had no children was a devoted aunt, and like a mother to her sisters' and brother's children. In all the relations of life she bore her part well as wife, sister, aunt, neighbor, friend. Her charities were unnumbered. Her activities as president of the Ladies Aid Society were a blessing to Jewish orphans. Temple Sinai enjoyed her beneficence.

Now, all this side the grave is over, and those who loved her have only her dearness and her loss over which to weep. These have our sympathy.

Besides her husband, she leaves four sisters, Mrs. Jos. Perlinsky and Mrs. Nathan Hiller of Canton, Miss., Mrs. Mary Meyer and Mrs. Hattie Hartson of New Orleans, and one brother, Emanuel Mayer of Baton Rouge. Mrs. A. M. Michel of St. Francisville and Dave M. Hartson of this place are among the many nieces and nephews, who all loved her as never aunt was loved.

The funeral took place, Thursday morning at 10 o'clock in Hebrew Rest, three miles from St. Francisville.

As no one attended the U. D. C. Convention to represent West Feliciana Chapter, its proxy was given to Mrs. C. S. Childress of New Orleans.

CHARTER

Of the John F. Irvine Co., Ltd., Bayou Sara, La.

State of Louisiana, Parish of West Feliciana.

Be it known that on this 17th day of March in the year of our Lord One Thousand Nine Hundred and Eight, before me, A. Villaret, Clerk and ex-officio Notary Public in and for the said Parish and State, duly commissioned and qualified, and in the presence of the witnesses hereinafter named and undersigned, personally came and appeared the parties whose names are hereunto subscribed, who declare that availing themselves of the provisions of the laws of this State relative to corporations, and especially of Act No. 36 of 1888 of the General Assembly of the State of Louisiana, they have convened and agreed and by these presents covenant, agree and bind themselves, as well as other persons as may become associated with them, to form and constitute a corporation and body corporate in law for the purposes and objects, and under the stipulations, articles and conditions following, to-wit:

ARTICLE I. The name and title of this corporation shall be "John F. Irvine Company Limited" and it shall exist and continue for a term of fifty years from date hereof. It shall have its domicile in the Town of Bayou Sara, Parish of West Feliciana, State of Louisiana; and the President thereof, or in his absence the Vice-President thereof, shall be the proper person or officer upon whom all citations, all legal process shall be served.

ARTICLE II. This corporation shall have the power to contract, sue and be sued, to make and use a corporate seal, and the same to break and alter at pleasure, to hold, receive, lease, purchase, sell and convey, as well as mortgage and hypothecate, under the corporate name, property, both real and personal, to borrow and lend money, to give and receive securities therefor, to name and appoint such officers, managers, directors and agents, as the convenience and interest of said corporation may require; to make and establish such by-laws and rules and regulations for said corporation as may be necessary and proper, and the same to alter and amend at pleasure.

ARTICLE III. The objects and purposes for which this corporation is organized, and the nature of the business to be carried on by it, are hereby declared to be the following, to-wit: A general merchandise, advancing, and commission business, the wholesale and retail selling of merchandise, groceries and all kinds of supplies, including the purchase and sale of agricultural products and live stock, in the said Town of Bayou Sara, and Parish of West Feliciana, and throughout the State of Louisiana and elsewhere, and to that end to buy and sell, advance and supply, direct and on commission, and generally to do all things as is usually incident and pertinent to such business.

ARTICLE IV. The capital stock of this corporation shall be Forty Thousand Dollars (\$40,000.00) divided into four hundred shares of One Hundred Dollars each, and said corporation shall be authorized to commence business as soon as the shares shall have been subscribed. The stock shall be paid for in cash at the time of subscription or at such times, and upon such notices, and in such amounts as may be fixed by the Board of Directors, or the same may be issued at not less than par in payment or in exchange for property or rights actually received, or purchased by said corporation, or the same may be issued fully paid for money advanced, and for such other valuable considerations or services as the Board of Directors may determine; provided no stock shall be issued until the consideration therefor has been actually received by the corporation.

Any stockholder may sell, assign and transfer his stock in this corporation provided thirty (30) days prior notice of said intention to sell, assign or dispose of the same, be given to the corporation, and the stockholders thereof, in the order of preference beginning with the largest stockholder, shall have the first privilege of purchasing the same; after which thirty (30) days notice, the said stock may be sold in the open market. The stock of this corporation will be transferred under the above conditions, provided such transfers be made on the books of the corporation at its office, and on surrender of the certificates therefor. The Board of Directors shall have the right to determine how much stock shall be issued.

ARTICLE V. The corporate powers of the association shall be vested in a board of five directors, consisting of the President, the Vice-President and the Secretary and two stockholders; three members of the said Board of Directors shall constitute a quorum for the transaction of business and their decisions shall be valid corporate acts. The following persons shall constitute the first Board of Directors: John F. Irvine, F. G. Hochenedel, G. M. Lester, E. C. Lee, and G. O. Rettig. No person shall be eligible for director or an officer who is not a stockholder of this association. The above named Board of Directors shall continue in office until the first Monday in February 1909, on which date and annually thereafter, a Board of Directors shall be elected unless said day shall be a holiday, then the said election shall be held on the next legal day thereafter. Members of the Board of Directors shall hold office until their successors are elected and qualified. Notice of election shall be given by at least ten days publication immediately preceding said election, in a newspaper published in the Parish of West Feliciana, and the Board of Directors shall appoint one or more stockholders to preside at such a commissioner or commissioners. In the event of the failure of any commissioner or commissioners to attend, the President shall by appointment fill the vacancy. Any failure from any cause whatever to elect directors on the day named for that purpose shall not dissolve the corporation, but the President shall cause another election to be held within thirty days, and shall give notice thereof as above provided. At every election and meeting each stockholder shall be entitled to one vote for each share of stock registered in his name, and may vote by written proxy. The election of directors shall be by ballot, and the majority of votes cast, each share of stock to be counted for one, shall elect the person or persons for whom they have been cast. After each election the Board shall elect from among their members, the officers of said company. During the absence of the President, the Vice-President shall act in all matters as President.

ARTICLE VI. The Board of Directors shall have full power to fill vacancies in their number from among the stockholders of the corporation. The said Board shall have full control of the property of this association, and shall so conduct, manage and use same as in their discretion they may deem fit, and that is consistent with the objects and welfare of the association. The said Board shall elect or appoint such other officers, agents, employees, clerks, and servants as may be deemed necessary for the conducting of the business of the corporation; fix their compensation and term of service, with the right to discharge them at pleasure; and said Board shall have the right to determine and fix

the salaries of the several officers herein provided for.

ARTICLE VII. This charter may be changed, modified, or amended, or this corporation may be dissolved at a general meeting of the stockholders convened for that purpose, with the consent of three fourths of the entire stock present or represented at this meeting. Ten days prior notice of such meeting shall be given in any daily newspaper published in the Parish of West Feliciana, or of twenty days if published in a weekly newspaper. In case of dissolution or termination of this corporation either by limitation of its charter, or from any cause, the liquidation of its affairs shall be conducted by three commissioners selected from among the stockholders with like assent, and at a meeting called for that purpose, as above set forth in this article. Said commissioners shall remain in office until the affairs of said corporation shall have been fully liquidated. In case of vacancy from any cause in said commissioners, the remaining commissioner or commissioners shall continue to act.

ARTICLE VIII. No stock of this corporation shall ever be responsible or held liable for the faults thereof, in any further sum than the unpaid balance due the company on the shares of stock subscribed for or owned by him, nor shall any informality in organization have the effect of rendering this charter null or of exposing a stockholder to any liability beyond the unpaid balance, if any, of his stock.
