MINUTES OF PARISH SCHOOL BOARD OF WEST FELICIANA.

October, 4, 1913.
 The regular quarterly meeting of the School Board of West Feliciana was called to order at 11 o'clock, the following members being present: J. P. Bowman, E. A. Wright, J. I. Daniel, P. S. Johnson, O. D. Brooks, J. E. Ortis, C. H. Argue, and W. B. Smith.
 The minutes of the meeting of July 5th were read and, on motion, approved.

On motion and second, the supt. and president of the board were authorized to borrow \$1,500 from the Bank of Jackson the money to be used in paying off the 1st pay roll.

On motion and second, the supt. was authorized and make arrangements for moving the Cat Island school to a more desirable place. An appropriation of \$25.00 was made in order to make such changes.

On motion and second, Mr. E. Robinson was named the official printer of the board, at the salary of \$100 per year. The ruling of the Board at the July meeting in regard to the compensation of a printer was rescinded.

On motion, the supt. and Mr. J. I. Daniel were authorized to have a partition and necessary improvements made in the Star Hill school.

Mr. Thom, representing the New Hope school, addressed the Board in behalf of the school, asking for a new school house, to be located at the most convenient place. A committee, composed of Mr. Howard Spillman, Mr. P. S. Thom, and Mr. Garner Smith, was named, the said committee to decide on the location of the New Hope school.

The superintendent was authorized to meet this committee, and to advise them in their selection.

On motion and second, the length of the school term of the colored schools was made 4 months.

There being no other business to be transacted, the board, on motion, adjourned.
