BE EQUIPPED FOR COLD NIGHTS.

Kansas City Star:

Doctors agree that the chief reason why disease is more prevalent in winter than in summer is the failure of most persons to get enough fresh air. Homes, street cars, office buildings are usually badly ventilated.

Increasingly people are finding the sleeping porch an advantage in winter as well as in summer. For commonly the sleeping porch is left open and the people who use it are steeped in fresh air all night.

It is possible to get a hint from the sleeping porch that is of advantage to people whose homes are not equipped with this latest luxury. The normal person would doubtless get all the fresh air he needed at night in winter if he would leave all the windows of the bedroom wide open. Usually he resolves to do this at the beginning of winter. But as the cold weather comes on his good resolution oozes away. Gradually he finds himself decreasing the size of the window openings, until in zero weather all the air that gets in must come through a narrow crack.

The lesson of the sleeping porch is to prepare for cold sleeping quarters. Then the temptation to keep the windows closed will disappear.

The person who sleeps outdoors knows it will be cold. So he gets ready for it. Cotton flannel sheets replace linen on the bed. He provides himself with flannel nightgowns or pajamas. He puts a foot warmer of some sort into the bed. He finds that a pillow gets ice cold during the night, and after he has been awakened a few times by the effect of the icy pillow on his cheek when he turns over, he gets an outing flannel hood, within which his head is snug and warm. Once having made all these preparations, and having equipped the bed with plenty of bedding, he no longer regards open air sleeping with apprehension. He is ready for the cold and there would be no object in shutting out the air from the porch.

Let the person who is sleeping indoors make similar preparations to resist the cold, and then he will find he has the will power to keep his windows wide open. The natural inclination to shut them is almost always a response to the instinct to be comfortable. If he is equipped to be comfortable in spite of the cold, the chances are that he will rejoice in the invigorating effect of fresh air breathed all night.
