**RED CROSS CONTINUES  
GOOD WORK**

Sixty-five tons of knitting yarn, originally purchased by the American Red Cross for making of socks and sweaters for American soldiers, has been manufactured into 78,000 yards of cloth and 23,000 shawls fifty inches square and shipped abroad to help provide for the destitute war sufferers of Europe.

In addition, the American Red Cross has since the first of the year, shipped 1,060,617 pounds of yarn and more than 22,500,000 yards of material for the making of garments. This material will be used in France or sent to Belgium, Poland and the Balkan States where most needed, and will be fashioned into garments by the people who are to receive it.

It is estimated that the German invasion of France and Belgium alone made wanderers of 1,250,000 formerly happy country-people, and Red Cross investigators have reported the need for clothing among these and other war sufferers as being even more imperative than food.

shing's visit. I have some pictures of the General just after he had shaken hands with me and we are laughing at him because the cameras are clicking all around him.

**Helping Italian Travelers**

Yesterday one of the guards stationed at the depot came running over to beg me to go to the train and see if we couldn't do something for some Italians who were on board. I ran over with him and found about ten families crowded in the small compartments of this dirty French train. They were coming from America and had money but the French authorities would not give them food. The children were crying and looked half starved. So I ran back to the canteen, stated the facts to the girls and loaded some baskets with bread, milk and salmon. The boys carried it over and I distributed it among the children. Tears of joy ran down the mother's faces as they thanked me in broken English. The old men muttered in Italian their thanks to the "nurse." One woman begged me to do something for her baby it had been ill on the trip and an older child had died a few days before on the road. I had to swallow hard when I was assuring her that the baby would be better soon.

You know we see more suffering in one day here than I ever imagined existed in the whole world. Some nights we can't sleep for thinking of it and some meals we can't enjoy because we "aren't hungry." But the boys that are here in France in the American army are the bravest, most sympathetic and kind hearted bunch of men in the whole world I think for there isn't anything they wouldn't do for each other, "for my buddies" as they say and I have never yet seen them deaf to an appeal for aid from some poor unfortunate. Coonie says that up near St. Michiel she saw a soldier pass a kid, the child said, chewing gum? the soldier took the gum he was chewing, handed it to the kid and each passed on his way the "petite" chewing his gum and the soldier perhaps thinking of home. And they all are thinking of home. They have thought so long of home and can't get back until many, many of them are marrying French girls.

**Glimpse of Pretty Country.**

We went to Beaune the other day in a car, with Boone the K. C. secretary here, he is from Oklahoma city. We carried sandwiches, candy and fruit for our lunch. It is about an hour and half ride from Dijon. There are 15,000 students here in this town. They have built a city of their own to accommodate the students and teachers, this was formerly a large hospital center also. The ride was through beautiful country right against the mountains on one side and farms on the other with many little villages in between. Every building that one sees looks like it was built in the year one and the fence put around it at that time also. They use stone exclusively
