Special Meeting of Police Jury.

President D. B. Williams of the Police Jury of Winn Parish has issued a call for a special meeting of the body for Monday, February 23, at 10 o'clock, in the court house here, pursuant to a petition signed by more than 125 citizens, residents and legal voters of Winn Parish. This special meeting is called for the purpose of taking some action regarding the government farm demonstration work as set out in said petition, voting upon an appropriation of \$900. This upon an appropriation of \$900. This appropriation is to be supplemented by the general government with \$300 for the purpose of placing a government agent in the field of Winn Parish for a period of one year to carry the message of scientific agriculture and stock raising that the farmers' yields may be thus increased and their burdens lightened.
