We do not approve of unnecessary noise because our fire whistle is fully adequate for any occasion and our city council will be prevailed upon to pass ordinances to prohibit the shooting of fire arms and the unnecessary blowing of steam whistles all of which tend to excite and confuse the people as well as the members of the Fire Department.
