School Board Proceedings.
Winnfield, La. April 1, 1910.
The Board of School Directors of the Parish of Winn met in regular stated communication with the following members present:
Ward 1. C. McGinty; ward 2, J. E. Curry; ward 3, L. B. Hinton; ward 4, J. R. Sholars; ward 5, J. C. Crew; ward 6, T. F. Wade; ward 7, G. A. Bennett; ward 8, B. E. Wilson; ward 9, A. Nugent; ward 10, A. L. Martin.
Motion prevailed adopting the minutes as read.
Motion, G. A. Bennett, prevailed to accept the report of the committee appointed to adjust the boundaries as follows:
Beginning at S. W. corner Section 27 Tp. 13 N. R. 2 West, running East one half mile, thence North one half mile, thence East three fourths mile to N. E. corner Sec. 13, all in Tp. 13 N. R. 2 West.

On motion Mr. Wade the president of the school board is hereby authorized to accept \$35.00 in compromise of judgment held against Richard Curry by B. W. Bailey, and transferred to the School Board of the Parish of Winn recorded in Judicial Mortgage "Book A," page 130. Carried.

Motion Mr. Sholars that deed to school site from W. R. Tilton for the Natchie school be accepted. Carried.

On motion Mr. Crew a school is to be continued in the New Morning Star colored districts for sessions of 1910 and 1911. Carried.

Motion Mr. Wade prevailed, authorizing the superintendent to insure all the property in the parish belonging to the Board of School Directors.

On motion Mr. Carry, a temporary school is hereby located in the Eastern portion of the Beech Creek School District near the Ebenezer Church. Carried.

Adjourned.

Met Saturday Morning with all members present.
Motion Mr. Martin that the School Board go into the election of a fiscal agent for the ensuing two years by secret ballot, was carried and resulted in the election of the Bank of Winnfield.

Mr. T. F. Wade offered the following motion:
The Board of School Directors of the Parish of Winn, having accepted the bid of the Bank of Winnfield under the laws of the State of Louisiana, letting of the funds coming under it's contract. Therefore, be it resolved that the bid of the said bank hereto attached and made a part of this resolution, that Bank of Winnfield is hereby declared the fiscal agent of the Parish Board of School Directors, for the ensuing two years beginning April 1, 1910.

Be it further resolved, etc., that the president of the Bank and Superintendent of Public Schools and Ex Officio Treasurer be instructed and authorized to sign contract with said Bank in accordance with it's bid hereto attached.
Motion Mr. Bennett that the president of the Board of School Directors of the Parish of Winn is hereby authorized to make a deed to the Pine Tree Lumber Co., for two acres of land formerly deeded to the Parish Board for a school site for the Winn School as soon as the house is removed from said property. Carried.

Motion Mr. Sholars, that the Board of School Directors do hereby authorize the Secretary to pay \$10.00 or as much thereof as necessary to each member who attends the School Board Association to be held at Baton Rouge on April 15th, 1910, also the Secretary is authorized to send \$5.00 membership fee, due by each Parish Board to the President of the Louisiana School Board Association before April 15th. Carried unanimously.

Motion Mr. Wade, that the schools of Winn Parish be closed April 14 and 15, and that all teachers who attend the State Teachers Association at Baton Rouge be paid their regular salary for the days suspended. Carried.
Motion Mr. Sholars that the Secretary be authorized to draw warrant to pay for Winn's prorate of the expense of running the Wyatt School in Jackson Parish. Carried.

Comprising Sections 6, 7, 17, 18, 19, 20, 30, 31, Township 13 N. R. 4 West and Sections 1, 2, 3, 10, 11, 12, 13, 14, 15, 22, 23, 24, 25, 26, 27, 28, 29, 30, 31, Tp. 13 N.
