

SENATOR S. D. McENERY IS DEAD

A Distinguished Democrat and Able Statesman, He Was Deeply Beloved by His People Who Often Honored Him and now Sorrow at his Death.

Louisiana Tuesday morning was plunged into that sorrow and regret which only the death of a great statesman can bring to the hearts of a loyal people whom he had served most faithfully, fearlessly and ably, through the death of United States Senator Samuel Douglas McEnery, which sorrowful and almost totally unsuspected event occurred this morning at 9:40 o'clock at his home, after an illness of little more than a day. Louisiana mourns a faithful, fearless, alert son and guardian of her interest. Democracy a potent and powerful adherent, exponent and champion of its principles, the fast dimming memory of the Lost Cause one of the bravest and most distinguished links which bound it to the present, and the community a citizen of such high moral worth and integrity, such inestimable value as to make his passing an irreparable loss.

He was taken ill en route from Washington, after the close of Congress and the completion of his always well-performed duties as representative in the National Senate but none had any thought that his condition was serious. In consequence the news of his demise came as a most sorrowful shock to every one of the many hearts throughout Louisiana in which the venerable statesman was held in profound esteem. The news of his death spread rapidly. Within half an hour it was known not only throughout the city but throughout the greater portion of the State, where telegraph and telephone lines reach out their tentacles. Even distant Washington and the home of his colleagues in the Senate from other

sections of the country were apprised of Louisiana's loss.

Senator McEnery had apparently been in his wonted state of health for some time past. His duties for the last session of Congress having ended, he started for home last Saturday afternoon. Shortly before reaching Lynchburg, Va., he suffered a violent attack of acute indigestion. Those in company with the venerable gentleman did all that lay in their power to relieve his sufferings. At Lynchburg Mr. James Ewing, son of Col. Robert Ewing, boarded the same train at the Virginia Military Institute, and immediately upon learning of Senator McEnery's illness hastened to his side and offered what assistance he might. The sufferer was somewhat relieved upon arrival in New Orleans on Monday.

Immediately he was taken to his home, physicians were summoned hurriedly, his family physician having met Senator McEnery at the depot and escorted him to his home. Through their combined efforts the malady from which he was suffering was subdued to some measure, and throughout Monday afternoon and the greater part of the night he apparently was resting easier, much relieved. Toward the morning hours, however, when human vitality is at its lowest ebb, he began to sink steadily despite the every effort of the attendant physicians, until, 9:40 o'clock Tuesday forenoon he laid down his earthly burden, and as if passing into a gentle slumber, closed a career crowned with honor and filled with those deeds of patriotism which marks the man of higher principle and love of State.

GOV. SANDERS FOR U. S. SENATOR

The Legislature is Nearly Unanimous in Choice of Gov. Sanders for Senator McEnery's Place, but He will Continue as Governor until December.

Baton Rouge, June 28.—While Governor Sanders himself absolutely declines to discuss the senatorial situation created by Senator McEnery's death, it was the intention of close friends that he will agree to become a candidate with the understanding that he will remain as Governor until Congress meets in December. It is perfectly plain from a sounding of the two Houses that the governor will be elected by a practically unanimous vote.

News of the death of Senator Samuel D. McEnery struck the Capitol today with stunning force. In its personal sense it created profound and universal regret; it fell like a bombshell, complicating an otherwise placid situation.

At first blush the election of Governor Sanders to succeed to the vacancy seemed the inevitable result. That would have the effect of elevating Lieutenant Governor Lambermont to the executive office.

The fact that the death occurred during the session of the Legislature makes it necessary for that body to choose a successor or let the State go unrepresented for the next two years.

The Governor will be without authority to make an appointment during the two years recess. Senator McEnery's term would have expired on March 31, 1915. His successor for the full time will be nominated in the State primary in 1912, and elected by the Legislature of that year. Governor Sanders' ambition to go to the Senate has been an open secret. It was, however, a fact well known to those having intimate knowledge of official affairs that he had notified both Senator Foster that so long as either of them lived he would not oppose the one or the other.

Washington, June 29.—Many persons in Washington when they learned that it was probable that Gov. Jared Y. Sanders would be elected Senator to succeed the late Senator McEnery were well pleased. Governor Sanders, on various visits to Washington at the Governors' conference, rivers and harbors gatherings and on his recent visit with a Louisiana delegation in the interest of the "Logical Point," made an excellent impression in Washington. He will come to the Senate exceptionally well and favorably known in Washington as an eloquent speaker, and a forceful, progressive character.

Judge Murff Announces.

In another column will be found the announcement of Hon. A. J. Murff for Congress from this the Fourth District. His declaration of principles will appeal to the average voter, and will be read with interest. He is the first to "shy his castor" into the ring, although it is probable that the present incumbent will be a candidate for re-election. The coming Congress will be a most important one if the Democrats should be in a majority as seems almost a certainty, and it lends importance to the selection of our representative.
