RED CROSS CHRISTMAS SEALS

National Association for the Study and Prevention of Tuberculosis Has Completed Plans.

Two hundred million Red Cross Christmas seals are now being printed and distributed by the American Red Cross and the National Association for the Study and Prevention of Tuberculosis, according to a statement issued by the latter organization. The proceeds from the sale of these seals will go for the fight against tuberculosis in the communities where the seals are sold.

The organization of the Red Cross seal sale this year will take in every state and territory of the United States, including Hawaii, Porto Rico, and the Canal zone. By December 1, over 500,000 workers, men, women and children, will be engaged in the campaign.

The sale in 1914 broke all previous records, totaling over 55,000,000 seals, an increase of 22 per cent over 1913. After deducting all expenses, this left nearly \$500,000 for tuberculosis work in this country. The money has been and is being expended by over 2,000 different agencies who benefited from the sale in amounts ranging from \$100 or less to over \$25,000. The American Red Cross announces that it will continue its previous successful policy of charging only 10 per cent of the gross proceeds to state antituberculosis associations, thereby encouraging local work.

Christian Epic in Stone.
Just back of the line of battle in Alton, within the zone where thorough destruction is threatened, stands one of the marvelous, most worth while works of civilization stands exposed to the varying chances of battle. This is the beautiful cathedral of St. Francis, an architectural glory which makes mock of modern satisfactions at the expense of earlier centuries. The enormous old minster, where wherever joy in the ideal is felt, is the choicest Gothic visions ever dreamed of, a master mason, is a memory of ages when art was more of a passion and religion, and less a means for preference and daily bread. St. Francis cathedral is a Christian epic in stone. Exquisite in proportion and detail, it rises, a great pile, out of the surrounding city. The spire of the minster is a masterpiece, excelled by no other steeple and equaled by no tower. After finishing the one spire, the proposed companion to it. Strassburg differs from other German cathedrals in that it possesses a greater spire in proportion to its height. The building was begun in 1176.
Believe Oil Ship Sunk.
Great quantities of floating oil have been coming into St. Andrews bay, and more than ten miles deposits of oil were made along the coast. It is a patrol, but thicker oil, and has caused no little inconvenience to bathers. The worst sufferers are sea birds, many of which had their feathers so matted with oil as to render them helpless.
