### NEW PIPE LINE

Has Been Merged with the Jennings Pipe Line.

The tank line to which mention was made in the Times Thursday as running from the oil field of Mermentau was Thursday merged with the Jennings pipe line and will be under the same management as the Jennings line. This was agreed upon at a meeting of the Southern, Jennings and Jennings-Heywood Syndicate Oil companies held that night. These three companies are jointly interested in the marketing of the oil and will work together for the best interests of the Jennings oil field and Jennings. The proposed line will be started as soon as pipe can be gotten here. The joining of these three companies make a combination that is formidable and to whom obstacles mean nothing.

Bricklayers Ordered Out.

Last Friday afternoon a little dispute arose between the contractor and the bricklayers engaged on the building of Knott Bros. & Co. and C. E. Taylor & Co. over the refusal of the contractor to allow full time to any of the workmen for a job, constituting a day's work, that was not accepted by the owner of the building. President Tilbury, of the Jennings Local Bricklayers Union, was telephoned for and came over that evening and at 5 o'clock ordered the workmen to strike, which was promptly complied with. J. H. Conley, who has the contract for the woodwork, went to Jennings Saturday morning and after a conference with T. J. Howard, the brick contractor, the matter was temporarily adjusted and the men were requested to return to their work.

It is said the president of the local union acted entirely without the authority of the Jennings organization, and the calling out of the workmen here met with the disapproval of the majority of the members.

ORDINANCE No. 83.

An Ordinance Ordering Sidewalks. Be it Ordained by the Mayor and Board of Trustees of the Town of Welsh, Louisiana:


Section 1. In compliance with a petition, properly signed by a sufficient number of residents of the Town of Welsh, and by authority of the charter and ordinances of said town of Welsh, sidewalks be and are hereby ordered to be built as follows: Beginning at the end of old walk on lot 8, in block No. 60, thence north along the west side of Polk street, as extended to the northeast corner of block No. 14, of the West & West subdivision of the Town of Welsh.

Sec. 2. Be it further ordained, etc., That it shall be the duty of all owners of land fronting on Polk street, as mentioned in Section 1 of this ordinance, to construct said walk as required by Ordinance No. 52, and in accordance to specification and grade to be furnished by the secretary of this board.
