Work is progressing nicely on the new buildings in town. The brick stores of Knott Bros. & Co. and C. E. Taylor & Co. are now in the hands of the plasterers and will be completed within a few days.

A bundle of rice raised on L. E. Robinson's plant was brought to town Friday and put on exhibition in Mr. Robinson's office. The specimen was well headed and showed no evidence of the drouth. Mr. Robinson will have a heavy yield this year.

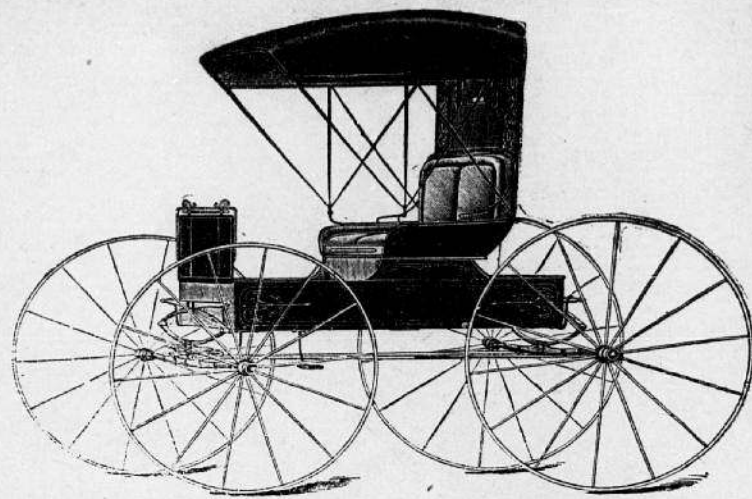
