### AN ORDINANCE

Providing for the levying and collection of  
taxes on all property, real and personal,  
within the corporation of the town of Welsh,  
for the year 1902.

**SECTION 1.** Be it ordained by the Mayor and  
Board of Trustees of the town of Welsh, La.,  
that for the purpose of defraying the necessary  
expense of the town of Welsh, La., for the  
year 1902, a tax of five mills on the dollar of  
the assessed valuation of all taxable property  
in the town of Welsh be and is hereby levied  
for the maintenance of public schools for the  
year 1902.

**SEC. 2.** Be it further ordained, &c., that by  
authority of an ordinance adopted by the  
Board of Trustees and the property tax payers  
of the town of Welsh, La., on the 11th day of  
July, 1899, a tax of five mills on the dollar of  
the assessed valuation of all taxable property  
in the town of Welsh be and is hereby levied  
for the maintenance of public schools for the  
year 1902.

**SEC. 3.** Be it further ordained, &c., that all  
taxes hereby levied shall constitute a lien and  
privilege on all taxable property paramount to  
all other liens, State and Parish taxes ex-  
cepted, and shall become due at the same time  
and be collected in the same manner as pro-  
vided for the collection of State and Parish  
taxes.

**SEC. 4.** Be it further ordained, &c., that all  
taxes hereby levied shall become delinquent  
on and after January 1, 1902, and shall draw  
interest at the rate of two per cent per month  
from January 1, 1902, until paid.
