AMENDMENT TO CHARTER OF Calcasieu Implement Co., Ltd.

STATE OF LOUISIANA.)
Parish of Calcasieu.)
Before me, Lee E. Robinson, a duly commissioned and qualified notary public, on this day personally came and appeared Paul W. Daniels, Thomas McMillan and H. S. Daniels, all residents of said parish and state, each of whom declared unto me that they collectively held the stock of the Welsh Implement and Vehicle Company, Limited, and that at a special stockholders' meeting of said corporation held at the town of Welsh at the expiration of fifteen (15) days notice as required by its charter, said meeting being held on the seventh day of December, A. D. 1901, said charter was amended by a vote of all of the stock present and represented, so that articles one, two and eight (1, 2 and 8) should read as herein set forth, just as provided in the original act of incorporation; and as so amended they shall govern the corporation in the future.

ARTICLE I.

The name and title of this company shall be "Calcasieu Implement Company, Limited," in which name it shall enjoy a succession of property and all of the powers, authority, rights, privileges and immunities vested by law in corporations; and its domicile or principal place of business shall be in Welsh, Calcasieu parish, Louisiana.

ARTICLE II.

The purposes and objects for which this corporation is established, and the nature of business to be carried on by it, are to be limited to conduct a general retail implement and mercantile business; to buy, sell, own, mortgage or hypothecate real estate or any character of movable property; to issue notes, drafts, checks or other evidences of debt; to conduct a farming, canal, irrigation, advancing, rice milling, either public or private warehouse business, and to perform all acts necessary for or incidental to any of the above enumerated branches of business.

ARTICLE VIII.

This corporation can be dissolved or any portion of its charter amended at either a regular or special call of the stockholders' meeting by a favorable vote of three-fourths (3/4) of the stock present or represented at such meeting. In case of the dissolution of the incorporation by liquidation, expiration of time, or a decree of court, the stockholders shall elect three (3) commissioners to act as liquidators and to wind up the corporate affairs in accordance with the resolutions of the stockholders' meeting appointing them. Witness their signatures hereto in my presence, and that of V. Wainwright and C. J. Wildman, competent and lawful witnesses, in the town of Welsh, this seventh day of December, A. D. 1901, each appearing subscribing the number of shares which they own respectively after their signatures hereto. (Signed)
