

ORDINANCE NO. 123.

An ordinance regulating the use of rice chaff as fuel by the Welsh rice mills and providing a penalty for its violation:

Be it ordained by the Mayor and Board of Trustees of the Town of Welsh;
That: It shall be unlawful for any rice mill sinated in the corporate limits of the Town of Welsh to burn any rice chaff in its furnaces as fuel, without first adopting effectual means of preventing scattering of said soot over the town.

as itel, without first adopting electual means of preventing scattering of said soot over the town.

Be it further ordained by the Mayor and Board of Trustees of the Town of Welsh: That: The owners of said rice mills are hereby granted a period of fifteen (15) days in which to provide and put in place the necessary equipments and devices for the arresting of said soot, and suppressing said nuisance.

Be it further ordained by the Mayor and Boardof Trustees of the Town of Welsh. La.: That: Anyone violating this Ordinance after the expiration of the fifteen (15) days shall be fined in a sum not exceeding Fifty Dollars and not less than Ten Dollars, or imprisonment for a period not exceeding Thirty Days nor less than Three Days.

Be it further ordained by the Mayor and the Board of Trustees of the Town of Welsh: That: This Ordinance take effect from and after its promulgation.

Be it ordained by the Mayor and Board of Trustees of the Town of Welsh. La.:

That: Section 2 of Ordinance No. 107 be amended as follows:

Section 2. That for every business of keeping a barroom, cabaret, coffee house, cafe, beer saloon, grog shop, beer house, beer garden or other place where anything to be drunk or eaten on the premises is sold either directly or indirectly, selling or giving away distilled, alcoholic or mail liquors, whether said business is carried on by itself or in connection with some other business or calling the license shall be \$2,750.

Second class—When said gross annual receipts are \$25,000, or less, and over \$10,000, the license shall be \$2,500.

Thirt class—When said gross annual receipts are \$15,000 or less, and over \$10,000, the license shall be \$2,500.
