Council called to order in regular session by the Hon. Mayor A. T. Jones. Members of the Board of Trustees present: J. A. Martin, R. M. Gray and Chas. Dautel. Minutes of previous meeting read and approved, whereupon the following business was taken up and disposed of:

Moved and carried that all bills favorably passed upon by finance committee be allowed and paid.

Upon presentation of bill of American Seating Co., of \$1,006.20, one-half of which to be cash Jan. 1, 1910, and balance Jan. 1, 1911, less freight and other advances, it was moved and carried that the Mayor pay by warrant, the cash payment, less freight and advances, and execute note, bearing 6 per cent interest, due Jan. 1, 1911, for remainder.

Moved and seconded that A. T. Jones be authorized to pay note of 1,500 at bank with interest; motion carried.

Moved that the Mayor appoint as a permanent street committee, the Mayor and Street Commissioner to be ex-officio; motion Carried. Chas. Dautel and W. B. Gabbert were appointed as committee.
