CHINESE PART WITH QUEUES

THOUSANDS CELEBRATE BIRTH OF THE NEW REPUBLIC.

Hoisting of Flag in New York—National Song to Time of "America" Sang by Chinese Girls and Boys.

New York.—A celebration of the establishment of the Chinese republic, coincident with the inauguration of its first president, was held in Chinatown Monday. Hundreds of Chinese rushed to their barbers early in the day and had their queues cut away, severing, as they said, the last symbol of Manchu rule. At noon when 3,000 Chinese gathered for the celebration not a queue was seen. Many of the Chinamen also shook off their sandals and in heavy American shoes climbed the stairs of the old joss house in Mott street, which was rechristened the Chinese Public Hall, and gravely bowed before a large portrait of the new president, Dr. Sun Yat Sen.

The hoisting of an enormous flag of the new republic on top of the old joss house was the signal for a celebration which would have done credit to any American football crowd. "Chung Hua, Chung Hua, Holla, Holla, Vive la, Vive la, Chun, Chung, Chun," fairly shook the old walls of the Chinatown district.

Chinese boys and girls, dressed Americanwise, sang a new national Chinese song, entitled "The Country of the Chinese Republic," to the air of "America." The sentiment of the song was something as follows:

"Dr. Sun Yat Sen has sown the seed and grown the republic. All of the Chinese should be patriots of one heart, one love and one life for their country, liberty and freedom. Manchu rule is gone and the Chinese shall remain forever free."

More than five hundred of the new Chinese flags were displayed in the district with portraits of the new president. There was a parade through the district and speech-making at the public hall. The shops contributed almost their entire supply of firecrackers, hundreds of thousands of them being thrown from roofs and balconies.

TEXAS LEADS IN IRRIGATION.

During Year Just Closed 75,000 Acres Made Ready—Projects Are Being Financed to Add 200,000 Acres.

San Antonio, Tex.—According to W. L. Rockwell, United States irrigation expert in charge of the work in Texas, this State has shown a larger increase in irrigated acreage than any State of the Union. During the year just closed 75,000 acres have been made ready for the crops and by the end of the present year it is estimated 120,000 acres will be added to the total. Projects are now being financed which will add 200,000 to the total acreage to be irrigated within the next three years. These figures do not include small tracts of 100 to 1,000 acres in many instances for they are not reported to the irrigation expert in charge. If all figures were available it would probably increase the total 10 per cent.

The work of irrigation has but started, despite the good showing made, said Mr. Rockwell. During the past year the proven area of shallow water has been extended over thousands of acres in the Panhandle and he said that on account of the relatively small cost of irrigation the year 1912 would see hundreds of small irrigation enterprises launched there. While the individual tracts to be put under irrigation there will not be large, they will in the aggregate amount to thousands of acres.

Advent of New Road.

Brownwood, Tex.—Amid scenes of general rejoicing and festivity the Brownwood North and South line of the Frisco system was formally opened Monday at May, Texas, with the driving of the golden spike by Brooke Smith of Brownwood and the public "hanging," for the "heinous crime of pessimism," of Newt Spence of May, who had expressed a doubt that the road would ever be built. About 1,500 people witnessed the ceremonies, including W. C. Nixon of St. Louis, vice president and general manager of the Frisco lines and president of the new road. For the opening excursion from Brownwood to May 450 tickets were sold, which added to the number of guests made a party of about 500 from Brownwood, including some guests from Fort Worth.

New Criminal Clerk.

Houston, Tex.—Mr. Barney Owens, the appointee of Governor Coquitt, to the position of criminal district clerk of Harris county, was inducted into that office on Monday. Judge Cornelius W. Robinson of the criminal district court administered the oath of office, and the filing of the necessary bond made Mr. Owens the incumbent of the office.

Governor Foss Indorsed.

Boston, Mass.—A resolution indorsing Governor Eugene N. Foss for the democratic nomination for the presidency of the United States and indorsing his administration was adopted by the democratic state chairman committee at a meeting Monday.

James McDaniel Found Dead.

Hannibal, Mo.—James W. McDaniel, who was the first literary adviser of Samuel L. Clemens (Mark Twain), was found dead in bed at his home Monday.
