Heavy Rains Retard Planting.

Just as the ground had gotten into good condition for planting, and farmers were beginning to think of putting their crops into the ground heavy rains began falling Sunday and continued through the greater part of the night putting the ground into such a condition that it will not be possible to get into the fields again for several days, should there be no further precipitation Up until the present time there has been little or no seeding done, although there has been considerable corn planted and potatoes and garden stuff put into the ground. Plowing and the preparation of the ground is, however well under way, and with the coming of dry weather the work of seeding will progress rapidly.
