

Aged Lady Thrown from Wagon Seriously Injured.

Mrs. Glick, mother of the Glick brothers, formerly well known in this locality, was thrown from a wagon last Saturday, and sustained very serious injuries. She was coming into town with Mrs. A. H. Bowers and one or two other ladies, when just east of the bridge on Russell Avenue, the neck yoke gave way, and permitted the wagon tongue to come down. This frightened the mules they were driving and caused them to start in a run. It seems that the two elderly ladies, Mrs. Bowers and Mrs. Glick were in the back seat of the conveyance, Mrs. Bowers either jumped out or was thrown out but suffered but temporary injuries. Mrs. Glick, who was thrown out on the other side suffered a much more serious fate, having her limb fractured in two places, near the ankle and also near the hip, as well as receiving a serious blow on the head where she struck the wheel.

She was picked up and conveyed to Mr. Hackworth's home, near where the accident occurred, and medical aid was summoned at once. Later she was conveyed in the doctor's auto to her home, and all is being done for her that medical skill and loving nursing can do.

Mr. and Mrs. Glick were pioneers here having come to this country in an early day, and helped to develop it when settlers were few. However for several years past they have been in the north, and returned here but a few weeks ago for a visit with relatives and friends.

Light Showers Alleviate the Dust and Aid Vegetation.

Light showers have been falling in this section of the state for several days, which although not general, are doing much good to the localities they hit. While the ground is still in good condition for working, the showers are very acceptable, as the dust has again become quite disagreeable and young rice as well as other vegetation needs surface moisture.

Regular Directors' Meeting of the Southern Rice Growers' Association Postponed.

The regular monthly meeting of the Directors of the Southern Rice Growers Association, which should have been held the first of this month in Beaumont, was indefinitely postponed, on account of the absence of the President, Mr. Dunlap, of Beaumont. Mr. Dunlap is and has been for some time in Washington, devoting his time and attention to protecting the rice interests so far as is possible.

The work of the Association is progressing rapidly in all parts of rice belt. The increase in contract membership in the Association from August first to January 29th was 97 1/2 per cent over the increase during the same period a year ago. This increase was put on during the selling season, when there was less time being devoted to securing new members than to taking care of the old ones. The increase up to May 15th is more than 130 per cent over the enrollment of last season.

The case of *Wiel vs. Louisiana State Rice Milling Co.*, which has been in the courts for some little time, and is of considerable interest to the rice growers was decided last week, judgment being rendered in favor of the Louisiana State. This decision sustains the validity of the Southern Rice Growers' contract, and resulted in a saving to the owner of the rice of about \$300.00. Philip Coverdale, local manager of Welsh branch of the Southern Rice Growers' Association went to the Northern part of the parish the first of the week, where he expects to remain for a couple of weeks, soliciting members to the Association.

CHARTER OF WELSH CARRIAGE & IMPLEMENT CO., LIMITED.

State of Louisiana; Parish of Jefferson Davis.

Before me, Lee E. Robinson, a Notary Public and for the Parish of Jefferson Davis and State of Louisiana, duly commissioned and qualified, in the presence of the competent witnesses, hereinafter named and undersigned, on this day personally came and appeared, W. H. Lanz, President, and E. H. Boling, Secretary, of Welsh Carriage & Implement, Limited, a corporation duly organized and existing under the laws of the State of Louisiana, domiciled at Welsh, in said Parish and State, acting herein by virtue of a resolution of the stockholders of said corporation, a certified copy of which resolution is hereto annexed and made a part hereof who declared, that in accordance with, and availing themselves of, the laws of the State of Louisiana in such cases made and provided, and pursuant to the authority granted by said resolution of the stockholders of said corporation, they do hereby increase the capital stock of said corporation to the sum of Fifty Thousand (\$50,000.00) Dollars, and do hereby amend and re-enact Article III, of the Charter of said corporation, which charter was passed before J. W. Bryan, Notary Public, on the 9th day of March, A. D. 1901, and duly recorded in Book 4 at page 409 in the Office and ex-office Recorder in and for Calcasieu Parish, Louisiana, so as to read as follows:

ARTICLE III
The capital stock of the corporation shall be Fifty Thousand (\$50,000.00) Dollars divided into and represented by Five Hundred shares of the par value of One Hundred Dollars, each, which stock shall be paid for in cash or its equivalent. No stock shall in any case be issued until the consideration therefor has been received by this corporation.

Any stockholder may sell, assign or transfer his stock in this corporation, provided thirty day's prior notice is given the other stockholders of such intention, and they shall have the first privilege of purchasing the said stock or any part thereof. But no transfer shall be valid until the same has been entered on the books of the company at its office in Welsh, Louisiana, and no transfer of any part of a share shall be made.

This corporation shall commence business as soon as Five Thousand Dollars of the capital stock is subscribed and paid for.
