ORDINANCE No. 165.

AN ORDINANCE regulating the speed of Automobiles and Motor Vehicles, providing that they shall carry Lights, providing that warning shall be given on approaching corners...

Section 1. That Automobiles or Motor Vehicles shall not be run upon any street or driveway of that part of the town that is platted into streets or blocks...

Section 2. Be it further ordained, that every Automobile or Motor vehicle shall between one half hour after sun set and one half hour before sun rise, carry two lights, placed in front, and one light placed in rear thereof.

Section 3. Be it further ordained, that each Automobile shall be numbered, and a record of numbers, and owners of cars, be kept on file by the City Clerk.

Section 4. Be it further ordained, that before turning corners or crossing streets, proper alarm shall be given to warn persons passing upon said streets.

Section 5. Be it further ordained, that any person violating this ordinance shall be fined in the sum of not less than \$5.00 and not exceeding \$30.00 or be imprisoned not less than one day and not more than 30 days...
