ORDINANCE NO. 175

AN ORDINANCE ordering a special election to be held in the Town of Welsh, Louisiana, to take the sense of the property tax payers of the said town as to whether or not there shall be levied and collected a special tax of three (3) mills on the dollar annually for a period of ten years, 1914 to 1923, both inclusive, on all the assessed and assessable property in the Corporate limits of the Town of Welsh, Louisiana, as provided by Act No. 256 of the General Assembly of Louisiana for the year 1910, and in accordance with all other laws on the same subject, for the purpose of aiding and maintaining the public schools in the Town of Welsh, Louisiana, during said period; and repealing all ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict herewith.

SECTION 1. BE IT ORDAINED by the Mayor and Board of Trustees of the Town of Welsh, Louisiana, in regular session convened, that a special election be and the same is hereby ordered to be held in the Town of Welsh, Louisiana, on the 8th day of September,

A. D. 1914, from seven o'clock a. m. until and not later than five o'clock p. m. in accordance with Act No. 256 of the General Assembly for the year 1910, and all other laws on the same subject, to take the sense of the property tax payers legally qualified to vote within the corporate limits of the said town under the provisions of said Act 256 of 1910 and all other laws on the same subject, as to whether or not there shall be levied and collected a special tax of three (3) mills on the dollar annually for a period of ten years, 1914 to 1923, both inclusive, on all of the assessed and assessable property within the limits of the said Town of Welsh, Louisiana, for the purpose of aiding and maintaining the public schools in the Town of Welsh, Louisiana, during said period.

SECTION 2. BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED etc., that the following is hereby designated and prescribed as the form of ballot to be used in said election:

Notice To Voters: To vote in favor of the proposition submitted upon this ballot, place a cross (X) mark in the square after the word "YES." To vote against it, place a similar mark after the word "NO."

SECTION 3. BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, etc., That the following named persons are hereby appointed as commissioners and clerk to hold and conduct said election; M. L. Farlow, C. E. Carr and J. R. Robicheaux commissioners; and W. E. Plauche, clerk.

SECTION 4. BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED etc. That the Mayor and Board of Trustees of the Town of Welsh, Louisiana, shall meet on the 10th day of September 1914, at 9 o'clock, a. m. at the Town Hall, and in open session proceed to open the ballot boxes, examine and count the ballots in number and amount, examine and canvass the returns, and declare the results of the election; and, in the event of a result favorable to said tax, to pass any and all ordinances as may be required, and especially an ordinance levying the authorized tax for the time stated in this ordinance, and designating the years in which the same shall be levied and collected.

SECTION 5. BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED etc. That all ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict herewith are hereby repealed.

POLICE JURY MEETS

Summary of Proceedings of the Regular Monthly Meeting Yesterday. District Attorney Edwards Files Mandamus on Court House and Jail Proposition.

The regular monthly meeting of the Police Jury yesterday was marked by a distinct break in the regular order of proceedings. As was generally expected District Attorney Edwards was on hand armed with his resolution on the jail proposition. The resolution was referred to the Ordinance Committee which was referred back to the Police Jury with majority report unfavorable and a minority report favorable. The resolution went through all the details for building a new jail by issuing certificates of indebtedness etc. The roll call of votes showed 6 voting nay and 3 voting aye. The pet resolution of the District Attorney was therefore consigned to its long home. The sad fate of the scheme aroused the indignation of the said prosecuting officer of the law and suiting his conduct to the frame of mind with which he was possessed at the time he walked over immediately and filed a mandamus suit against the Police Jury and in the said suit he will seek to require the Police Jury not only to build a jail but also a Court House.

Another matter of some importance was the ordering of an election on local option. Quite a petition was presented favoring an election, and a majority of the Police Jury favored calling an election on the project. The date of the election was set for December 1st.

The Police Jury also withdrew the ordinance proposing an election for the creation of Road District No. 1 in this Parish until sometime later.

The official publication of the entire proceedings will appear in our next issues.
