Ordinance No. 2.

An ordinance authorizing the in-
curring of an indebtedness of

Ninety Five Thousand Dollars,
(\$95,000.00) upon Subdivision

"A" of Grand Marais Drainage
District No. 1 for the purpose

of leveeing, pumping, draining
and reclaiming the lands em-

braced within said Subdrainage
District "A" and authorizing

the issuance of bonds repre-
senting said indebtedness, said

bonds maturing at intervals
from 1917 to 1947, both inclu-

sive, from the date of issuance,
bearing interest at the rate of

five per cent per annum, inter-
est payable semi-annually.

Section 1. Be it ordained, by the
Board of Commissioners of Grand

Marais Drainage District No. 1, that
acting upon the authority of a petition

presented to us, duly executed by the
owners of more than two-thirds of the

acreage comprised within the confines
of Subdrainage District "A," and in

accordance with the report of the
Board of State Engineers, made upon a

survey of lines and levees of said dis-
trict, which report declares that it is fea-

sible to thoroly drain and reclaim said
Subdrainage District "A," let and bid to

exceed Twelve Dollars (\$12.00) per acre,
for nine thousand six hundred (\$9600)

acres contained within said Subdrainage
District; that the character of the land

within said Subdrainage District "A" is
rich, prairie lands, all of which is more

fully shown by the report on file with
Secretary of this Board, and in accordance

therewith, they do hereby incur on
behalf of said Subdrainage District "A"

of Grand Marais Drainage District No.
1, an indebtedness of Ninety-Five

Thousand Dollars (\$95,000.00) Dollars,
and as evidence of said indebtedness,

do hereby authorize the issuance by
the President and Secretary of this Dis-

trict, under the seal thereof, of one
hundred ninety (190) bonds of Five

Hundred Dollars (\$500.00) each in de-
nomination, said bonds bearing inter-

est at the rate of five (5) per cent per
annum, payable semi-annually, on the

first days of April and October of each
year.

Section 2. Be it further ordained
etc., that one hundred ninety (190)

bonds of Five Hundred Dollars (\$500.00)
each, representing a bonded indebted-

ness incurred by the preceding section
of this ordinance shall mature upon the
