Election Proclamation.

State of Louisiana,  
Parish of Jefferson Davis.

Pursuant to the authority contained in Ordinance No. 87 of the Police Jury of the Parish of Jefferson Davis, of date the 2nd day of September, 1915, I, John H. Cooper, President of said body, hereby give notice that an election will be held in Road District No. 2 of the Parish of Jefferson Davis, on the 19th day of October, 1915, as set forth in the following abstract of said ordinance:

Section 1. Be it ordained, by the Police Jury of the Parish of Jefferson Davis, in lawful session convened, that an election shall be, and is hereby, called to be held in Road District No. 2 of the Parish of Jefferson Davis on the 19th day of October, 1915, at which election a majority of the property taxpayers of Road District No. 2 of the Parish of Jefferson Davis, in number and amount, eligible to vote and voting, shall determine the proposition to incur debt and issue bonds of said Road District No. 2 of the Parish of Jefferson Davis to the amount of one hundred twenty-five thousand dollars (\$125,000.00), to run for a period of twenty-five years, bearing interest at the rate of five per centum (5) per annum, payable semi-annually, the funds thus derived to be used for the purpose of building and improving the highway system in said Road District, as follows: To build, construct and surface, with some approved material, a system of good roads or modern highways within said district, according to the map, plans and plats attached to the petition and filed of record.

The said election shall be held at the following polling place and by the officials named, each being a registered voter:

At Jennings, at the Mayor's office. Election Commissioners: Charles Daughenbaugh, E. A. Toups, Guy Connally. Clerk of Election: L. L. Crowl.

Notice is hereby further given that: On the 20th day of October, 1915, the first day following such election, at 12:00 M., the Police Jury will meet at the courthouse at Jennings, in the Parish of Jefferson Davis, Louisiana, and there in public session open the ballot boxes, examine and count the ballots, both as to number and amount, and examine and canvass the returns, and declare the result of said election, and promulgate the same.

Ordinance No. 179.

AN ORDINANCE, making it a misdemeanor to break, attempt to break, or to assist others in breaking or attempting to break the Town Jail, and providing penalties for its violation.

Sec. 1. Be it ordained by the Town Council of Welsh, That any person or persons breaking, attempting to break, or assisting others to break or attempting to break the jail of the Town of Welsh, shall be guilty of a misdemeanor and upon conviction shall be fined not less than twenty-five (\$25.00) Dollars, nor more than Fifty Dollars. And in default of payment shall be imprisoned for not more than Thirty (30) days.

Sec. 2. Be it further ordained, Etc., That this ordinance shall become effective immediately upon promulgation.
