Ordinance No 18

AN ORDINANCE ordering a special election to be held in School District No. 10, in the Parish of Jefferson Davis, for the purpose of submitting to the qualified electors of said school district the question of levying a special tax of five (5) mills, for the purpose of providing additional aid to the public school of the said school district.

Section 1. Be it ordained by the Parish Board of School Directors of the Parish of Jefferson Davis, Louisiana, that a special election be and is hereby ordered to be held in School District No. 10, in the Parish of Jefferson Davis, Louisiana, on the 19th day of October, 1915, for the purpose of submitting to the qualified electors of the said school district the question of levying a special tax of five (5) mills on the dollar of all property in said school district subject to State taxation, for a period of ten (10) years, the proceeds of the said tax to be used in giving additional aid to the public schools of the said school district.

Section 2. Be it further ordained, etc. That the ballots to be used at the said election shall be prepared by the secretary of the Parish Board of School Directors, and shall be in the following form:

Proposition to levy a five (5) mill special tax on all property subject to State taxation, for the purpose of providing additional aid to the public school of the said school district. YES NO

NOTICE TO VOTERS: To vote in favor of the proposition submitted upon this ballot, place a cross (X) mark in the square after the word "YES"; to vote against it, place a similar mark after the word "NO."

Section 3. Be it further ordained, etc. That the Secretary of the Parish Board of School Directors be and is hereby ordered to cause to be prepared for the use at the said election the tally sheets, lists of qualified electors, assessed valuation of property, blank statements for the compilation of the votes, in number and amount, and other election blanks that may be required for the purpose of holding the said election, to cause the same to be placed in the ballot boxes for the use at the respective precinct, and to make provision for the transmission of the ballot boxes to the several precincts of school district at which the election is to be held.

Section 4. Be it further ordained, etc. That the polling place or precinct for the said election shall be the Town Hall in the Town of Welsh, and the following three commissioners and clerk of election are appointed to serve at said election: J. M. Fontenot, P. H. Goodreau, and M. L. Farlow, commissioners and C. E. Carr, Clerk.

Section 5. Be it further ordained, etc. That the Parish Board of School Directors shall meet at 9:30 o'clock A. M. on the 20 day of October, 1915, for the purpose in open session of examining and counting the ballots, canvassing the returns and declaring the results of the said election.

Section 6. Be it further ordained, etc. That the President of the Parish Board of School Directors be and is hereby instructed to give public notice of the said election by proclamation to be duly published, according to law, in the following form:

Proclamation Pursuant to a resolution passed by the Parish Board of School Directors of the Parish of Jefferson Davis, Louisiana, at its special session held on the 16th day of September, 1915, I, J. M. Booze, President of said Parish Board of School Directors, hereby give notice that, in compliance with said resolution, a special election will be held in School District No. 10, Parish of Jefferson Davis, Louisiana, on the 19th day of October, 1915, for the purpose of submitting to the property taxpayers qualified under the Constitution and Laws of the State of Louisiana to vote at said election, the following proposition:

To levy a special tax of five (5) mills on the dollar on all the property in School District No. 10, Parish of Jefferson Davis, Louisiana, subject to State taxation, annually, for a period of ten (10) years, for the purpose of giving additional aid to the public school in said school district of No. 10.

For the purpose of said special election the polling places will be the Town Hall in the Town of Welsh and the following commissioners and clerk have been appointed to serve at said election: Commissioners: A. O. Fontenot, P. H. Goodreau, and M. L. Farlow, Clerk: C. E. Carr.

At said special election the polls will open at seven o'clock A. M. and close at five o'clock P. M. and the election will be conducted in accordance with the laws of Louisiana applicable thereto.

M. on the 20th day of October, 1915, the said Parish Board of School Directors will meet at the Town Hall in the Town of Welsh, and in open session proceed to open the ballot box, examine and count the ballots in number and amount, examine and canvass the returns, and declare the result of said special election.

said school district subject to State taxation, for a period of ten (10) years, the proceeds of the said tax to be used in giving additional aid to the public schools of the said school district.

Ordinance No. 8.

SUB-DISTRICT "A" OF GRAND MARAIS DRAINAGE DISTRICT NO. 1 OF JEFFERSON DAVIS PARISH, LOUISIANA.

AN ORDINANCE authorizing the issuance of bonds prescribing the form and ordering the execution of interest coupons bonds of Sub-Drainage District "A" of Grand Marais Drainage District No. 1 of the Parish of Jefferson Davis, State of Louisiana, and authorizing the levying and collection annually for a period of thirty years an acre tax, or forced contribution, for the purpose of paying said bonds and the interest thereon which mature from year to year.

Whereas, a petition has been presented to the Board of Commissioners of Sub-District "A" of Grand Marais Drainage District No. 1 of the Parish of Jefferson Davis, State of Louisiana, executed by the owners of more than two-thirds of the acreage comprised within the confines of Sub-Drainage District "A", based upon a report of the Board of State Engineers, made upon a survey of lines and levies of said district, which report declared that it is feasible to thoroughly drain and reclaim the lands within the boundaries of said Sub-Drainage District "A" of 9600 acres at a cost of not to exceed \$1200000, which petition requests this Board to create a bonded indebtedness of Ninety-five Thousand Dollars on said Sub-Drainage District "A", and

Whereas, acting upon the authority of said petition, this Board did on March 3rd, 1915, pass and adopt Ordinance No. 3, authorizing the issuance of bonds representing said indebtedness of Ninety-five Thousand Dollars on said Sub-Drainage District "A", for the purpose of leveling, pumping, draining and reclaiming the lands embraced within said Sub-Drainage District "A", and authorizing the issuance of bonds representing said indebtedness of Ninety-five Thousand Dollars on said Sub-Drainage District "A", for the purpose of leveling, pumping, draining and reclaiming the lands embraced within said Sub-Drainage District "A", and authorizing the issuance of bonds representing said indebtedness, said bonds maturing at intervals from 1916 to 1945, both inclusive, from the date of issuance, and bearing interest at the rate of five per cent, per annum, payable semi-annually.

Section 1. Be it ordained by the Board of Commissioners of Sub-Drainage District "A" of Grand Marais Drainage District No. 1 of Jefferson Davis Parish, Louisiana, in session convened, that they do hereby authorize the issuance by the President and Secretary of this District, under the seal thereof, of Two Hundred Forty Two Bonds, in denominations of Five Hundred \$500 Dollars and One Hundred Dollars (100), said bonds bearing interest at the rate of five per cent, per annum, payable semi-annually, on the first day of January and July of each year; and the levying of an acre tax, or forced contribution, for an amount per acre sufficient to pay the interest on the bonded indebtedness of said District, the bonds as the same mature from year to year, and the cost of maintaining the drainage, each and every year.

Section 2. Be it further ordained, etc. that there shall be and is hereby ordered to be executed the negotiable coupon bonds of said Sub-Drainage District "A", in the sum of Ninety-five Thousand (\$95,000.00) Dollars, dated the first day of July, 1915, of the denomination of Five Hundred Dollars and One Hundred Dollars, numbered from One to Two Hundred Forty Two, both inclusive, and bearing interest at the rate of five per cent, per annum, payable semi-annually, thereafter on the first days of January and July in each year, said interest to be evidenced by interest notes or coupons attached to said bonds respectively, which bonds shall mature as follows:

Said bonds shall be signed by the President of the Board of Commissioners Sub-District "A" of said Grand Marais Drainage District No. 1, and countersigned by the Secretary, and the corporate seal of the Board of Commissioners of the Sub-Drainage District "A" shall be affixed thereto. The interest notes or coupons shall be executed by the lithographic and fac-simile signatures of said President and Secretary. Both principal and interest of said bonds shall be payable at the First National Bank in the City of Chicago, State of Illinois.

Section 3. Be it further ordained, etc. that said bonds, except as to number and date of maturity, shall be of substantially the following form:

This bond is one of a series of bonds of like tenor, except as to denomination, number and date of maturity, aggregating Ninety-five Thousand Dollars (\$95,000) issued under authority of Article 251 of the Constitution of the State of Louisiana, as amended, and in accordance with the provisions of Act No. 317 of the general Assembly of the State of Louisiana, passed in the year 1910, as amended, and Act No. 27 of the State of Louisiana, passed in 1914, and has been authorized by a resolution duly executed by the owners of more than two-thirds of the acreage comprised within the boundaries of said Sub-Drainage District and interest by an annual forced contribution or acre tax on every acre of land comprised within said Sub-Drainage District "A" sufficient to pay this bond and interest.

It is hereby certified and recited that all said bonds and things necessary to be done in relation to the issuance of this bond and the other bonds of this series, in order to make them legal, binding and valid obligations of said Sub-Drainage District "A", of said Grand Marais Drainage District No. 1, has been lawfully performed in and in accordance with the total indebtedness of

said district including this bond... In witness whereof, the President and Secretary of the Board of Commissioners of Sub-District "A" of Grand Marais Drainage District No. 1 of the Parish of Jefferson Davis, State of Louisiana, have hereunto set their hands and seals this 16th day of September, 1915.
