ORDINANCE NUMBER 23.

Ordering a special election to be held in School District No. 23 in the Parish of Jefferson Davis for the purpose of submitting to the qualified electors to the said School District the question of the levying of a special tax of Five (5) mills, for the purpose of providing additional aid to the public school of the said District number 23.

Section 1. Be it ordained by the Parish Board of School Directors of the Parish of Jefferson Davis, State of Louisiana, That a special election, be, and is hereby ordered to be held in School District number 23 in the Parish of Jefferson Davis, Louisiana, on the 5th day of July, 1916, for the purpose of submitting to the qualified electors of the said School District entitled to vote thereat the question of the levying of a special tax of Five (5) mills on the dollar of all property in the said School District subject to State Taxation, for a period of five (5) years, the proceeds of the said tax to be used in giving additional aid to the public school of the said School District number 32.

Section 2. Be it further ordained, etc., That the ballots to be used at the said election shall be prepared by the secretary of the Parish Board of School directors, and shall be in the following form:

Proposition to levy a Five (5) mills special tax on all the property subject to state taxation in School District number 23 in the Parish of Jefferson Davis, Louisiana, annually, for a period of five (5) years, for the purpose of giving additional aid to the public school of the said School District number 23.

Section 6. Be it further ordained, etc., That the President of the Parish School Board be, and he is hereby instructed to give notice of the said election by proclamation to be duly published, according to law in the following form:

Pursuant to an ordinance passed by the Parish Board of School Directors of the Parish of Jefferson Davis, Louisiana, at its regular meeting held on the 24th day of May, 1916, I, J. M.
