RESOLUTION.

Resolved by the Mayor and the Board of Trustees, at a regular meeting, held in the City Hall, Tuesday, Aug. 1, 1916,

That the Welsh Warehouse Company, Incorporated, be, and is, permitted to lay, under the supervision of the Street Commissioner, and to maintain, a four inch underground pipe line, along, and across, certain streets, as follows:

Beginning from the Texas Oil Company's tank situated on Lot 5 of Block 4, running west, along Welsh street to Coleman street, these south along Coleman street, across the Louisiana Western Railroad Company's right of way into Block 17.

The said Welsh Warehouse Company, Incorporated, must, and promises, to maintain the said pipe line free from any leaks, or obstructions, and further, must, and promises, to pay for any street work cost that may arise on account of the said pipe line.

ORDINANCE NO. 181.

An ordinance prohibiting the interference with telegraph, telephone and electric light wires erected and maintained by the Town of Welsh, La., or by the permission or authority of the Town of Welsh, La., and providing penalties for violation thereof.

Section 1. Be it ordained by the Mayor and Board of Trustees of the Town of Welsh, La., That it shall be unlawful for any occupant of any lands situated in the Town of Welsh, La., whether owner or leasee, or any resident owner of unoccupied lands to permit trees or any part of trees or shrubbery growing on any land owned or occupied by them to extend beyond the boundary line of said lands in such a manner as to obstruct or in any manner interfere with the maintaining and operating any telegraph, telephone or electric light wire erected or maintained by the Town of Welsh, La., or by authority of any franchise granted by the Town of Welsh, La.

Sec. 2. Be it further ordained, etc., That in the event trees or shrubbery growing on any of the lands situated in the Town of Welsh, La., shall grow or extend beyond the boundary line of the land upon which said trees or shrubbery grows in such a manner as to interfere with the proper maintaining or operating any telegraph, telephone or electric light wire in violation of this ordinance if the land upon which trees or shrubbery grows is occupied or owned by a resident of the Town of Welsh. The said occupant or owner of said land shall be notified by the street commissioner to remove said obstruction or interference; and failing to do so within five (5) days the said owner or occupant shall be fined not less than one (1) dollar nor more than twenty (20) dollars or be imprisoned not less than one (1) day nor more than ten (10) days, or both at the discretion of the Mayor.

If the said lands are unoccupied and owned by a non-resident the street commissioner shall give notice by registered letter sent to the last known address of said owner, to remove or cause to be removed said interference or obstruction and in the event said interference or obstruction be not removed within ten days then and in that event the street commissioner shall cause the same to be removed.

Sec. 3. Be it further ordained, etc., That the street commissioner shall render a statement of all expenses incurred by him in sending notices and statements and in removing interferences or obstructions that shall occur in violation of this ordinance on account of trees or shrubbery growing on unoccupied lands owned by non-residents, to the owner of said lands by registered letter to the last known address of said owner and in the event said owner shall neglect or refuse to pay the same before the next regular meeting of the town council of the Town of Welsh, La., the said town council shall assess the amount with twenty-five per cent additional to cover cost of recording and other necessary expense to the said lands upon which the said trees or shrubbery grows and said assessment shall constitute a first lien and privilege on all lands so assessed State, Parish and municipal taxes excepted, and shall draw interest at the rate of twelve (12) per cent per annum until paid all of which may be recovered in any court of competent jurisdiction.

Sec. 4. Be it further ordained, etc., That each and every five days that trees or any part of trees or shrubbery growing on occupied lands or upon unoccupied land owned by a resident of the Town of Welsh, La., shall be permitted to interfere with or obstruct the proper maintaining or operation of any telegraph, telephone or electric light wire in the Town of Welsh, La., in violation of this ordinance shall constitute a separate offense and shall subject the violator to all the penalties provided in Sec. 2 of this ordinance.

Sec. 5. Be it further ordained, etc., That this ordinance shall go into effect immediately after its adoption and publication and all ordinances or parts of ordinances contrary to or in conflict with the provisions hereof be and the same are hereby repealed. Adopted and approved August 1, 1916.

ORDINANCE NUMBER 29.

Ordering a special election to be held in School District No. 22 in the Parish of Jefferson Davis, for the purpose of submitting to the qualified electors to the said School District the question of the levy of a special tax of Three (3) mills, for the purpose of providing additional aid to the public school of the said District number 22:

Section 1. Be it ordained by the Parish Board of School Directors of the Parish of Jefferson Davis, State of Louisiana, That a special election, be and is hereby ordered to be held in School District number 22 in the Parish of Jefferson Davis, Louisiana, on the 15th day of August, 1916, for the purpose of submitting to the qualified electors of the said school district entitled to vote thereat the question of the levy of a special tax of Three (3) mills on the dollar of all property in the said school district subject to state taxation, for a period of five (5) years, the proceeds of the said tax to be used in giving additional aid to the public school of the said school district number 22.

Section 2. Be it further ordained, etc., That the ballots to be used at the said election shall be prepared by the secretary of the Parish Board of School Directors, and shall be in the following form:

Proposition to levy a Three (3) mills special tax on all the property subject to State taxation in School District number 22 in the Parish of Jefferson Davis, Louisiana, annually, for a period of five (5) years, for the purpose of giving additional aid to the public school of the said School District number 22.

Notice to Voters: To vote in favor of the proposition submitted upon this ballot, place a cross (x) mark in the square after the word "Yes." To vote against it, place a similar mark after the word "No."

Section 3. Be it further ordained, etc., That the secretary of the Parish Board of School Directors be, and he is hereby ordered to cause to be prepared for use at the said election the tally sheets, lists of qualified electors, assessed valuation of property, blank statements for the compilation of the vote, in number and amount, and other election blanks that may be required for the purpose of holding the said election to cause the same to be placed in the ballot box for the use at the respective precincts, and make provisions for the transmission of the ballot box to the several precincts of the school district at which the election is to be held.

Section 4. Be it further ordained, etc., That the polling place or precinct for the said election shall be the school house at Elton and the following three commissioners and clerk of the election are appointed to hold the election: Commissioners, R. E. Powell, T. S. Plunket and Allen Delarue; Clerk, Robert Buller.

Section 5. Be it further ordained, etc., That the Board of School Directors shall meet at 9:30 o'clock A. M. on the 16th day of August, 1916, for the purpose in open session, of examining and counting the ballots, canvassing the returns and declaring the results of the said election.

Section 6. Be it further ordained, etc., That the President of the Parish School Board be, and he is hereby instructed to give notice of the said election by proclamation to be duly published, according to law in the following form:

PROCLAMATION.

Pursuant to an ordinance passed by the Parish Board of School Directors of the Parish of Jefferson Davis, Louisiana, at its regular meeting held on the 7th day of July, 1916, I, J. M. Booze, president of said Parish Board of School Directors, hereby give notice that in compliance with said resolution, a special election will be held in School District number 22, Parish of Jefferson Davis, Louisiana, on the 15th day of August, 1916, for the purpose of submitting to the property tax payers qualified under the Constitution and laws of the state of Louisiana to vote at said election the following proposition, to-wit:

To levy a special tax of Three (3) mills on the dollar on all the property in School District number 22, Parish of Jefferson Davis, Louisiana, subject to State taxation, annually, for a period of ten (10) years, for the purpose of giving additional aid to the public school in said District number 22.

For the purpose of said special election the polling place will be the school house at Elton, Louisiana, and the following commissioners and clerk of the election have been appointed to serve at this election: Commissioners, R. E. Powell, T. S. Plunket and Allen Delarue; Clerk, Robert Buller.

At said special election the polls will be open at seven o'clock A. M. and close at five o'clock P. M., and the election will be conducted in accordance with the laws of Louisiana applicable thereto.

Notice is also given that at 9:30 o'clock A. M., on the 16th day of August, 1916, the Parish Board of School Directors of the Parish of Jefferson Davis, Louisiana, will meet at Jennings, Louisiana, and in open session proceed to open the ballot box, examine and count the ballots in number and amount, examine and canvass the returns, and declare the results of said special election.
