OFFICIAL MINUTES OF POLICE JURY

(Concluded from page one)

shall be given in writing to the contractor, and this contract shall thereupon cease and terminate, and in such case the amount of money which may then remain unpaid and would otherwise be payable to the contractor under this contract, including the percentage retained on all monthly estimates, shall be forfeited to the Parish and shall be kept, retained and appropriated by

Witnesseth: Whereas, it is necessary for the party of the first part to make arrangements for the payment of the legally authorized obligations of the Parish of Jefferson Davis over which said party of the first part shall have control; such deposits to be made promptly as funds are collected.

2nd. The said party of the second part hereby agrees and obligates itself to pay said party of the first part interest at the rate of three per cent per annum on all deposits so made with it, said interest payments to be credited monthly on the average daily balances deposited by said party of the first part as herein provided.

3rd. Said party of the second part further binds and obligates itself to cash all warrants legally issued by the said party of the first part presented to it during the existence of this contract; said party of the first part to pay to the said party of the second part interest at the rate of eight per cent per annum on all payments from their respective dates so made by said party of the second part; said interest to be paid monthly on the daily average of the amount of warrants so paid by it, statement of interest due said party of the second part to be rendered and approved monthly.

4th. It is mutually stipulated and agreed that said party of the first part shall redeem all warrants so cashed by said party of the second part in the order in which said warrants are issued and as rapidly as funds on deposit to the credit of the said party of the first part, as herein provided, shall make possible.

5th. It is further understood and agreed that either party to this contract shall have the right to terminate it by giving the opposite party thirty days written notice of said intention. Provided however that said party of the first part shall exercise its right to terminate this contract only after it shall have redeemed its warrants which said party of the second part shall have cashed under the terms of this contract and shall have paid all interest that may be due said bank.

Be it further resolved, That J. Sidney Treme, President of the Police Jury, be and he is hereby authorized to execute said contract on behalf of the said Police Jury in his capacity as President, thereof, on said bank furnishing bond in the sum of Seven Thousand Five Hundred Dollars (\$7,500.00) to be continued during the period of the continuance of this contract, the said party of the first part to pay the premium for said bond.

The above resolution was introduced by Mr. Guidry and motion for adoption of same was made by him

the Parish as partial payment of damages which it shall be entitled to recover from the contractor for breach of this contract.

Whereas, the said J. N. George & Sons has neglected to carry out and perform the work stipulated in said contract as fast as necessary, and has failed to place upon said work sufficient force to insure its completion within the time and in the manner required by said contract and the modifications thereof subsequently entered into and has otherwise violated the provisions of said contract; and

Whereas, the Engineer representing the Police Jury of the Parish of Jefferson Davis has given notice to said contractor, J. N. George & Sons, as authorized by said contract, ordering and directing them to remedy said contract, and to proceed more rapidly with said work, to increase the force employed, and otherwise comply with the provisions of said contract; and

Whereas, more than three days have elapsed since the delivery of said notice in writing to said J. N. George & Sons, and the said delay being named in said notice within which the said J. N. George & Sons were required to comply with the demands set forth in said notice; and

Whereas, said J. N. George & Sons, have failed and refused to comply with the orders and instructions of said engineer within the time allotted in said notice;

Therefore, be it resolved, by the Police Jury of the Parish of Jefferson Davis, State of Louisiana, that said contract be and the same is hereby declared forfeited, in accordance with the provisions of said contract hereinabove set forth.

Be it further resolved, That all moneys which remain unpaid to the said contractor under said contract, if any, including the percentage retained by the Police Jury on monthly estimates, as provided in said contract, be and the same are hereby declared to be forfeited to the Parish, to be kept and retained by said Parish, and all of said funds hereby appropriated as a partial payment of the damages due and to become due by the contractor to the Police Jury of the Parish of Jefferson Davis for breach of said contract.

Be it further resolved, That a copy of this resolution, duly certified by the Secretary thereof, be forwarded to the said J. N. George & Sons by registered mail, said copy of said preamble and resolution to serve as written notice to said contractors of the action hereby taken, as required by said contract.

Resolution—Fiscal Agency.
 Be it resolved by the Police Jury of the Parish of Jefferson Davis, State of Louisiana, that the following contract be entered into between the said Police Jury, and the Calcasieu National Bank of Southwest Louisiana, at Lake Charles, Louisiana, to-wit:

Know all men by these presents: This contract made and entered into by and between the Police Jury of the Parish of Jefferson Davis, herein represented by J. Sidney Treme, its duly authorized President, party of the first part; and the Calcasieu National Bank of Southwest Louisiana a corporation organized under the laws of Louisiana, at its office in the city of Jennings, Louisiana, herein represented by H. H. Hoag, its duly authorized manager, herein called the party of the second part:

Witnesseth: Whereas, it is necessary for the party of the first part to make arrangements for the payment of the legally authorized obligations of the Parish of Jefferson Davis over which said party of the first part shall have control; such deposits to be made promptly as funds are collected.

2nd. The said party of the second part hereby agrees and obligates itself to pay said party of the first part interest at the rate of three per cent per annum on all deposits so made with it, said interest payments to be credited monthly on the average daily balances deposited by said party of the first part as herein provided.

3rd. Said party of the second part further binds and obligates itself to cash all warrants legally issued by the said party of the first part presented to it during the existence of this contract; said party of the first part to pay to the said party of the second part interest at the rate of eight per cent per annum on all payments from their respective dates so made by said party of the second part; said interest to be paid monthly on the daily average of the amount of warrants so paid by it, statement of interest due said party of the second part to be rendered and approved monthly.

Pursuant to authority from the Federal Inspector in charge of tick eradication work in the State of Louisiana, Mr. Guidry moved that general dipping cease Nov. 15th, 1918.
