HIGHWAY DEPARTMENT  
GRANTS HEARING ON  
MERMENTAU BRIDGE.

At the court house in Jennings yesterday morning a hearing was had by the Board of State Engineers on the plan of the proposed bridge across the Mermentau river. The purpose of the hearing was to consider the application and plans of the Highway Department.

The bridge is to be located 423 feet north of the Southern Pacific railroad bridge. Its clearances are as follows: Least horizontal clearance at right angles to axis of channel, 55 feet; least vertical clearance, low water, 13.7 feet; least vertical clearance, high water, 2.0 feet.

The result of the investigation should be made known soon.

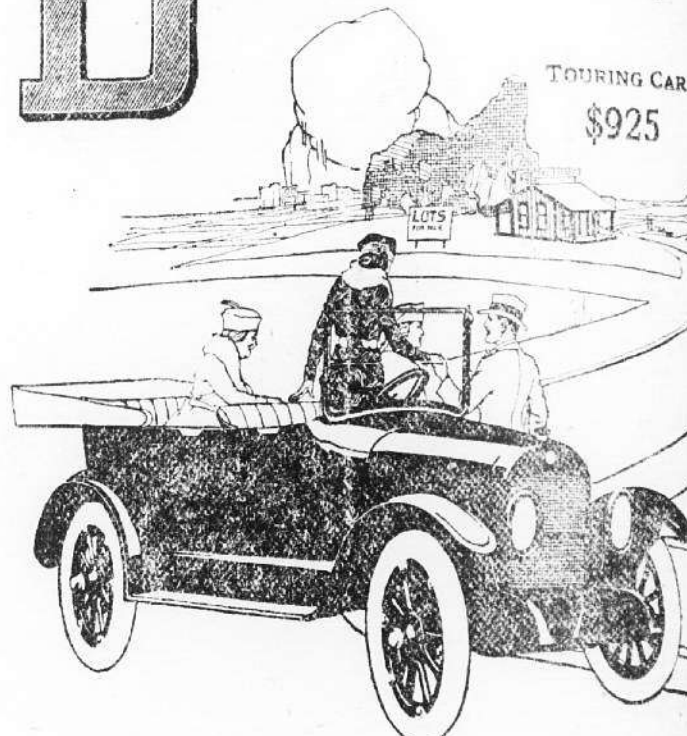
