The Board of Commissioners of the Thornwell Drainage District No. One met in called session at the domicile of the Board, Calcasieu National Bank, Lake Arthur, La., with the following members present: i. e.: E. A. Lyon, President, R. B. Johnson, Vice President, C. C. Potter, Marcel Guidry, R. R. Monger.

The meeting was called to order by the President, Mr. E. A. Lyon, and Mr. E. E. Baker, Secretary, officiating as such. Mr. R. B. Johnson moved the passage by the Board of Ordinance No. Eleven (11), same to be made a part of these minutes; seconded by Mr. C. C. Potter, vice President; carried unanimously.

Minutes of present meeting read by the Secretary and moved by Mr. R. B. Johnson to be adopted as read; seconded by Mr. C. C. Potter, put to a vote by the President and carried unanimously by acclamation as follows: E. A. Lyon, aye; R. B. Johnson, aye; C. C. Potter, aye; Marcel Guidry, aye.

Moved by Mr. R. B. Johnson that the meeting be adjourned. Seconded by Mr. C. C. Potter.

Ordinance No. 11.

AN ORDINANCE authorizing the issuance of bonds of the Thornwell Drainage District No. 1 of Jefferson Davis Parish, Louisiana, and levying a tax to provide for the payment of the principal and interest thereof:

WHEREAS, at an election heretofore called and held in Thornwell Drainage District No. 1 of Jefferson Davis Parish, Louisiana, there was

submitted to the qualified property taxpayers the proposition of authorizing said District to incur indebtedness and issue negotiable bonds therefor amounting in the aggregate to Twenty-four Thousand Dollars (\$24,000), payable in principal and interest out of a special ad valorem tax upon all the taxable property in said district subject to taxation, and

WHEREAS, due and timely notice for the period and in the manner prescribed by law was given of said election and a majority in number and amount of the property taxpayers qualified as electors under the laws and Constitution of the State of Louisiana voting thereat authorized the Commissioners to issue the bonds of the District in the said sum of Twenty-four Thousand Dollars (\$24,000); Therefore,

Section 1. BE IT ORDAINED by the Board of Commissioners of Thornwell Drainage District No. 1 of Jefferson Davis Parish, Louisiana, in session duly convened, that there shall be and are hereby ordered to be issued the negotiable coupon bonds of said District in the sum of Twenty-four Thousand Dollars (\$24,000). Said bonds shall bear date from the first day of October, 1919, shall be of the denomination of Five Hundred Dollars (\$500) each, and shall bear interest at the rate of five (5) per centum per annum, payable semi-annually on the first day of April and of October in each year, said interest to be evidenced by interest notes or coupons attached to said bonds respectively. AN ORDINANCE authorizing the issuance of the bonds of Thornwell Drainage District No. One of Jefferson Davis Parish, Louisiana, and levying a tax to provide for the payment of the principal and interest thereof:

WHEREAS, at an election heretofore called and held on the 27th day of May, 1919, in Thornwell Drainage District No. One of Jefferson Davis Parish, Louisiana, there was submitted to the qualified taxpayers the proposition of the levying and assessing of an annual contribution or acreage tax of nine (9) cents an acre for a period of twenty (20) years, beginning with 1919, upon all of the lands situated in said District; and

WHEREAS, there was also at said election submitted to the qualified taxpayers the proposition of authorizing the Board of Commissioners of said District to incur indebtedness and to issue negotiable bonds therefor amounting in the aggregate to the principal sum of Twelve Thousand Dollars (\$12,000), payable in principal and interest out of the amount to be raised by said annual contribution during said period; and

Section 1. BE IT ORDAINED by the Board of Commissioners of Thornwell Drainage District No. One of Jefferson Davis Parish, Louisiana, in session duly convened, that there shall be and is hereby levied a continuing annual acreage tax or annual contribution upon all of the lands within the corporate limits of the said District in the sum of nine cents an acre for a period of twenty years beginning with the year 1919 and ending with the year 1938, and provision to meet the requirements hereof shall in apt time, manner and season annually hereafter be made by this Board.
