MAIL ORDER DEPARTMENT OFFERS SUPPLIES DIRECT TO PEOPLE OF LOUISIANA.

Conditions and Prices are Named in Circular Issued by New Orleans Supply Officer.

New Orleans, La., Oct. 17.—Colonel E. S. Walton, Zone Supply Officer, announces that through the Mail Order Department, Army Retail Store, New Orleans, the following miscellaneous articles and food stores will be sold to people outside of New Orleans in Louisiana and Mississippi. Orders and conditions for sale will be the same as heretofore announced, viz: Fixed Quantity.

No individual can purchase more than the fixed maximum or minimum quantity shown in the list. The resale of supplies purchased by individuals is prohibited. No sale will be made to stores or hotels.

Postage. The Government pays all postage outside of New Orleans, for mail orders for Louisiana and Mississippi.

Insurance. Purchases over \$2.00 will be insured by the Government without any expense to the buyer. Purchases for amount under \$2.00 will be shipped at the purchaser's risk, unless the purchaser remits sufficient funds with the order to cover cost of insurance. Cost of insurance may be ascertained from the Postmaster.

Payment. Each order must be accompanied by Pot Office or Express Money Order, or New Orleans Bank Draft for the exact total value of the goods ordered, made payable to "Army Retail Store, New Orleans." Postage stamps or personal checks will not be accepted in payment for goods. It is not advisable to send cash and the government will not be responsible for any cash sent through the mail.

How to Order. Write your mail orders plainly, printing your name and address, giving list of supplies desired, with the quantities, prices and sizes, and accompany order by Post Office or Express Money Order, or New Orleans Bank Draft for the exact total value of the goods ordered. Address your envelope to ARMY RETAIL STORE, ARMY SUPPLY BASE, NEW ORLEANS, LA.

Blankets, wool, new, 2, \$6.00 each; Boots, rubber, high, new, 1 \$5.25 per pair; Drawers, summer, new, 4, \$5.00 pair; Hats, oil skin, new, 1, \$7.50 each; Leggings, foot, new, 2, \$7.50 pair; Overalls, combination, new, 1, \$2.50 pair; Stockings, summer, new, 6, 50 cents pair; Stockings, wool, light, new, 6, 25 cents pair; Towels, bath, new, 6, 45 cents each; Towels, huck, new, 6, 20 cents each; Undershirts, summer, new, 6, 50 cents each; Undershirts, winter, new, 2, \$1.00 each; Gloves, jersey knit, new, 2, 20 cents pair; Brushes, scrub, 1, 15 cents each; Candles, issue, lbs., 2, 20 cents pound; Handles, pick, R. R., 2, 21 cents each; Paper, toilet, rolls, 3 25 cents for 3; Picks, R. R., 2, 70 cents each.

Caution. Be careful to give correct sizes of clothing. Check and recheck your prices and additions carefully.

No goods will be exchanged or money refunded for articles once purchased and shipped. All goods offered for sale are new and in first class condition. The insurance will take care of any loss or damage in transit.



NATIONAL CAMPAIGN FOR PREVENTION OF ACCIDENTS.

Campaign Designed to Have Lasting Influence Over Fatalities on All Railroads.

Two million railroad employees in the United States entered Saturday at midnight upon an intensified campaign against accidents—the National Railroad Accident Prevention Drive. For two weeks, ending at midnight, Friday, October 31, caution and care will fight for a record clear of injuries and fatalities, which might have been avoided, on every railroad under government control.

Definite figures on results of the first twenty-four hours of the campaign probably will not be available for several days. Men and women, officers and employees, on the road, in shops, round houses, stations and offices along some 231,000 miles of railroad in every part of the country are involved, so time will be required to assemble and compile the daily reports.

The purpose of the drive is to eliminate so far as is humanly possible the avoidable accidents which constantly take a distressing toll of life and limb on the railroads, and thus to demonstrate what caution would mean if practiced day in and day out in the operation of the railroads. Previous campaigns conducted in regions and on individual railroads have given an idea of what can be done. The great nationwide movement is designed to produce a more forcible demonstration and with the co-operation of industries along the railroads, shippers, States and municipal authorities and the public generally, to bring the lesson home to everybody.

During the third week of last January the first of the regional safety demonstrations was staged in the Southern Region, with the remarkable result of eighty per cent reduction in accidents compared with the same week of January, 1918. This record has not been equalled in the other Regions and the Southern railroads have gone into the National competition determined to stay at the top.

To stimulate Southern Region employees in their fight for the record as the region of safest railroads, B. L. Winchel, Regional Director, with headquarters at Atlanta, Ga., has offered a handsome silver cup to be awarded to the employees of the group of lines showing the smallest number of accidents during the two weeks. There are eleven groups of railroads in the region, and the cup—known as "The Southern Region Trophy"—will be awarded upon the basis of the report of the eleven federal managers. The trophy is now on display at Atlanta.

When the drive is in full swing, daily returns from the Southern Region will be received and given to the public by C. M. Anderson, Regional Supervisor of Safety, Atlanta, Ga.
