

OFFICIAL MINUTES OF THE POLICE JURY OF JEFFERSON DAVIS PARISH

Jennings, La., Jan. 2nd, 1920. The Police Jury of the Parish of Jefferson Davis, State of Louisiana, met in regular session at the Court house in Jennings, Louisiana, on this day at nine o'clock, a. m. The meeting was called to order by Hon. J. S. Treme, President, and upon roll call the following members were present: Arthur Guidry, Ward 1. T. S. Walker, Ward 3. J. S. Treme, Ward 4. Ausem Marcantel, Ward 5. F. A. Arceneaux, Ward 7. Dolze Bourgeois, Ward 8. Yves Pitre, Ward 9. Messrs. R. M. Briggs, Ward 2, and A. T. Jones, Ward 6, being absent. The minutes of the regular session of this body held on the 4th day of December, 1919, were read and approved in open session. Petition for Public Road. Jefferson Davis Parish, Louisiana. Welsh, La., April 20th, 1918. To the President and Members of the Police Jury of the Parish of Jefferson Davis: Gentlemen: We, the undersigned citizens of Jefferson Davis Parish, La., respectfully ask your honorable body to appoint six commissioners to lay out and procure right-of-way for a public road from the SW corner of Section 17, Township 3-4, thence west to the gravel road running into Welsh.

from the southeast corner of section twenty-three (23), Twp. 11 S. range 4 west to intersect with the public road on the Spanish grant line near the southeast corner of the northeast quarter of section twenty-four (24) Twp. 11 S. range 4 west. We also recommend the appointment of Messrs. H. E. Walter, C. C. Potter, Jules Broussard, J. A. Gibson, F. B. Caffall and W. M. Buchanan. Petitioners: J. A. Gibson, W. M. Sweeny, Marcel Guidry, L. H. Pugh, C. Dudley. The above petition was submitted by Mr. Guidry, who moved that the same be adopted and that the commissioners as recommended be appointed. The motion was seconded by Mr. Pitre and upon being put was carried. Resolution. Be it resolved by the Police Jury of the Parish of Jefferson Davis, Louisiana, that the President of this body be and he is hereby authorized to execute approval of the bonds for the operation of service cars in Jefferson Davis Parish, in behalf of the Police Jury upon evidence satisfactory to him that the said bonds have been properly executed and with surety approved by him. The above resolution was introduced by Mr. Bourgeois, who moved that the same be adopted. The motion was seconded by Mr. Guidry and upon being put was carried. Mr. H. C. Fondren, U. S. Demonstration agent for the Parish of Jefferson Davis, appeared before the Police Jury and submitted a report of the work under his direction throughout the parish during the year 1919. The term of employment of Mr. H. C. Fondren, as Parish Demonstration Agent, having expired on January 1st, Mr. Walker moved that Mr. Fondren be now employed for the year 1920 at a salary of \$60.00 per month, payable monthly. The motion was seconded by Mr. Guidry and upon being put was carried. Mr. Guidry moved that Austin Fontenot be employed as Ferry Keeper for the Lake Arthur ferry to succeed Berton Vincent, resigned, at a salary of \$20.00 per month. Mr. Guidry moved that the Sheriff be authorized to purchase a typewriter for the use of the Sheriff's office and directed to trade in the old typewriter now used in the office.
