**HATCHING EGGS OF RIGHT KIND**

Proper Selection and Handling Is Absolutely Necessary to Get Strong Chicks.

**GIVE CARE AND ATTENTION**

Select Medium-Sized, Well-Shaped Eggs—Do Not Keep Over Two Weeks Before Incubating—Varied Diet for Hens.

(Prepared by the United States Department of Agriculture.)

Figs cannot be expected from this class and neither can a full hatch of strong chicks be expected from poorly-selected, carelessly-handled hatching eggs. The hens may be faithful sitters or the incubator, if one is used, be on its best behavior, but the best of incubation cannot overcome the handicap of poor eggs. Many a person who gives the chicks the best of care as soon as they are out of the shell, bestows on the eggs he is saving for hatching only the most cursory attention and then when only a few birds hatch out is surprised and grieved at his poor luck. Luck, those who know say, doesn't enter into successful poultry raising. It is eternal care and vigilance on the part of the owner of the flock that spells success or failure.

Breeding Stock Need Varied Diet.

Strong, fertile eggs are the prime essential in good hatching. These can only be obtained from stock properly mated and kept under the best possible conditions to secure health and vigor. Eggs from over-fat breeding stock do not usually produce a large percentage of strong chicks. If breeders are confined they should be fed a varied supply of grains, meat, and green feed, say the poultry specialists in the United States department of agriculture. The green feed assists in keeping the fowls in good breeding condition. The range is usually an important factor also in the production of hatchable eggs.

From 8 to 12 females of the American, or general-purpose class, and 12 to 15 of the Mediterranean class can be mated with one male, depending on his age and vitality. Abundant ventilation in the house is a great help in keeping the stock in good breeding condition.

Abnormal, small, and poorly-shaped eggs should be discarded. Do not set eggs which have thin or very porous appearing shells. Eggs should be set when fresh, if possible, and it is not advisable to use eggs for hatching which are over two weeks old, al-

though stale eggs will frequently hatch. Selecting uniformly large eggs for hatching, which are of the same color, is one of the quickest ways to secure uniformity in the offspring and increase the size of the eggs.

Dirty eggs should be cleaned by rubbing lightly with a damp cloth, but care should be taken not to rub off any more of the natural bloom of the egg than is absolutely necessary. Broken eggs in the nest may coat the rest with albumen. If this is not washed off the hatching qualities will be impaired.

**Do Not Allow Eggs to Chill.**

Eggs for hatching should be collected two or three times a day in freezing weather to prevent chilling. Broody hens allowed to sit on eggs in the laying nests all day may hurt the hatching qualities of the eggs.

Eggs in large numbers are generally kept in the cabinet or turning rack, for convenience in handling, in a room where the temperature is between 50 and 60 degrees Fahrenheit, if possible, although they will stand considerable variation. It is not necessary to turn eggs kept only for a few days, but it is advisable to turn eggs daily which are to be kept over a week. Various commercial turning devices are sold by poultry supply companies, or the eggs may be kept in cabinet drawers and shuffled about with the hands by removing a few eggs from the trays. Commercial egg cases are sometimes used for holding the eggs for hatching.

Eggs from different varieties of the same class of poultry may be incubated together, but it is not advisable to mix white eggs with brown eggs as white eggs often hatch a little earlier than brown eggs.

Neither the hen nor the incubator will hatch strong chicks from weak germs or from eggs which have not received proper care.

**ACTIVITY IN HIGHWAY WORK**

Up to July 1, 1919, State Bonds Aggregating \$224,800,000, Had Been Authorized.

Aside from money to be used co-operatively under the federal aid road act, aggregating nearly \$650,000,000, some states will expend large sums, and their several subdivisions will provide large additional amounts.

"It is interesting to note that up to July 1, 1919," says the secretary of agriculture in his annual report, "state bond issues aggregating \$224,800,000 had been authorized and approved by popular vote and that provision has been made for voting next year on proposals for the issuance of additional state road bonds to the extent of approximately \$314,000,000. During the present and the next fiscal year there will be made available for road improvement at least \$1,000,000,000. Certainly few laws, if any, have produced greater results, either in terms of expenditures for a good purpose or in terms of helpful legislation and machinery, than the federal aid road act. It seems clear, in the circumstances, that the principal limiting factors in the 1920 program will be those of rail transportation for, and production of, suitable road materials, the contractors' organizations available, and the labor supply."

During the past year oats have been in nearly every locality cheaper than corn. When corn goes down to \$1.50 a bushel, oats should be 75 cents and barley \$1.20 a bushel to give the same value as poultry feed.

Oats, with the hulls on, contain more indigestible matter than corn, and the indigestible hulls also make out less palatable to poultry and of less feeding value. An average sample of oats should be valued at about 12 to 15 per cent less than a good sample of cracked corn. The best wheat usually available for poultry is not actually worth more as a poultry feed than good cracked corn. Low-grade and damaged grains are suitable for poultry feed if birds in good condition will eat them readily.
