**ORDINANCE NO. 205
OF THE TOWN OF WELSH.**

BE IT ORDAINED by the Mayor
and Board of Trustees of the Town of
Welsh, La., that Section One (1) of
Ordinance No. One (1) of the Town
of Welsh, La., be amended to read as
follows:

Section 1. That it shall be unlawful
for any person or persons within the
corporate limits of the Town of Welsh
La., to be found drunk or behaving in
a disorderly manner, to use any loud,
vociferous, obscene, vulgar, profane
or indecent language, to swear, curse
or expose their person in such a man-
ner as to disturb the peace and quiet
of the said Town of Welsh, Louisiana.

Section 2. Be it further ordained,
etc., that any violation of this ordi-
nance shall, upon conviction, be pun-
ishable by a fine of not less than
Fifty (\$50) Dollars nor more than
Fifty (\$50) Dollars, or by imprison-
ment for not less than one (1) day nor
more than fifteen (15) days in jail, or
both fine and imprisonment, for each
offense, at the discretion of the May-
or.

Section 3. Be it further ordained,
etc., that any ordinance or parts of
ordinances in conflict herewith be and
are hereby repealed.

Section 4. Be it further ordained,
etc., that this ordinance shall become
effective from the date of its adop-
tion.

**ORDINANCE NO. 162,
PARISH OF JEFFERSON DAVIS.**

AN ORDINANCE levying and im-
posing a tax on the assessed valuation
of all property in the Parish of Jef-
ferson Davis, and its subdivisions, sub-
ject to taxation for the year 1921 for
all general and special purposes.

Section 1. Be it ordained by the
Police Jury of Jefferson Davis Parish,
State of Louisiana, in regular and
lawful session convened, that a Tax of
Two Mills on the Dollar of the assess-
ed valuation be and the same is here-
by levied, assessed and imposed upon
all property within the limits of Jef-
ferson Davis Parish, Louisiana, sub-
ject to taxation, to be applied to the
general and special accounts hereto-
fore budgeted by this Police Jury for
the year 1921, exclusive of the one
and one-half (1 1/2) mills set aside for
Public Schools in the ordinance bud-
geting the expenditures for the year
1921.

Section 2. Be it further ordained,
etc., that a tax of Three Mills on the
dollar of assessed valuation be and
the same is hereby levied, assessed
and imposed upon all property within
the limits of Jefferson Davis Parish,
Louisiana, subject to taxation, to be
applied to the support and the main-
tenance of the Public Schools of the
Parish of Jefferson Davis, State of
Louisiana, for the year 1921, in pur-
suance to Section Fifteen (15) of Ar-
ticle Twelve (12) of the Constitution
of 1921, of the State of Louisiana.

Section 3. Be it further ordained,
etc., that a tax of Two Mills on the
dollar of the assessed valuation be
and the same is hereby levied, assess-
ed, and imposed upon all property
within the limits of Jefferson Davis
Parish, subject to taxation for the pur-
pose of paying the principal and inter-
est upon the bonded indebtedness for

the year 1921 on the Jefferson Davis
Parish Highway Bond Issue.

Section 4. Be it further ordained,
etc., that a tax of one mill on the
dollar of the assessed valuation be
and the same is hereby levied, assessed
and imposed upon all the property
within the limits of the Pelican Road
District No. One (1), Jefferson Davis
Parish, Louisiana, subject to taxation
for the purpose of paying the princi-
pal and interest on the bonded in-
debtedness of the Pelican Road District
Number One (1), of Jefferson Davis
Parish, Louisiana, for the year 1921.

Section 5. Be it further ordained,
etc., that a tax of Six Mills on the
Dollar of the assessed valuation be
and the same is hereby levied, as-
sessed and imposed upon all the prop-
erty within the limits of the Lake
Arthur Road District Number one (1)
of Jefferson Davis Parish, Louisiana,
for the purpose of paying the princi-
pal and interest on the bonded in-
debtedness of the said Lake Arthur Road
District Number One (1) of Jefferson
Davis Parish, State of Louisiana, for
the year of 1921.

Section 6. Be it further ordained,
etc., that a tax of three (3) mills on
the dollar of the assessed valuation be
levied, assessed and imposed upon all
the property within the limits of Ward
Number One (1) of Jefferson Davis
Parish, State of Louisiana, exclusive
of incorporated towns in said Ward
subject to taxation, for the purpose of
making, grading, repairing and main-
taining dirt roads and bridges in said
Ward for the year 1921, pursuant to
the authority vested in this Police
Jury by virtue of a special election
held in said Ward on the 1st day of
July, A. D. 1919.

Section 7. Be it further ordained,
etc., that a tax of three (3) mills on
the dollar of the assessed valuation be
and the same is hereby levied, assess-
ed and imposed upon all the prop-
erty within the limits of Ward Num-
ber Two (2) of Jefferson Davis Par-
ish, State of Louisiana, exclusive of in-
corporated towns in said Ward, sub-
ject to taxation, for the purpose of
making, grading, repairing and main-
taining dirt roads and bridges in said
Ward for the year 1921, pursuant to
the authority vested in this Police
Jury by virtue of a special election
held in said Ward on the 1st day of
July, A. D. 1919.

Section 8. Be it further ordained,
etc., that a tax of Five (5) mills on
the dollar of the assessed valuation be
and the same is hereby levied, assess-
ed and imposed upon all the prop-
erty within the limits of Ward Num-
ber Three (3) of Jefferson Davis Par-
ish, State of Louisiana, exclusive of
incorporated towns in said Ward, sub-
ject to taxation, for the purpose of
making, grading, repairing and main-
taining dirt roads and bridges in said
Ward for the year 1921, pursuant to
the authority vested in this Police
Jury by virtue of a special election held
in said Ward on the 20th day of April,
A. D., 1920.

Section 9. Be it further ordained,
etc., that a tax of Three (3) mills on
the dollar of the assessed valuation be
and the same is hereby levied, assess-
ed and imposed upon all the prop-
erty within the limits of Ward Num-
ber Four (4) of Jefferson Davis Par-
ish, State of Louisiana, exclusive
of incorporated towns in said Ward,
subject to taxation, for the purpose
of making, grading, repairing, and
maintaining dirt roads and bridges
in said Ward for the year 1921, pur-
suant to the authority vested in this
Police Jury by virtue of a special elec-
tion held in said Ward on the 1st day
of July, A. D. 1919.

Section 10. Be it further ordained,
etc., that a tax of Two Mills on the
dollar of the assessed valuation be
and the same is hereby levied, assess-
ed and imposed upon all the prop-
erty within the limits of Ward Num-
ber Five (5) of Jefferson Davis Par-
ish, State of Louisiana, exclusive of
incorporated towns in said Ward, sub-
ject to taxation, for the purpose of
making, grading, repairing and main-
taining dirt roads and bridges in said
Ward for the year 1921, pursuant to
the authority vested in this Police
Jury by virtue of a special election

held in said Ward on the 1st day of
July A. D. 1919.

Section 11. Be it further ordained,
etc., that a tax of Five mills on the
dollar of the assessed valuation be
and the same is hereby levied, assessed
and imposed upon all the property
within the limits of Ward Number

Ward for the year 1921, pursuant to

September, A. D. 1919.

Section 12. Be it further ordained,
etc., that a tax of Three (3) mills on
the dollar of the assessed valuation be
and the same is hereby levied, assess-
ed and imposed upon all the prop-
erty within the limits of Ward Num-
ber Seven (7) of Jefferson Davis Par-
ish, State of Louisiana, exclusive of
incorporated towns in said Ward, sub-
ject to taxation, for the purpose of
making, grading, repairing and main-
taining dirt roads and bridges in said
Ward for the year 1921, pursuant to
the authority vested in this Police
Jury by virtue of a special election
held in said Ward on the 1st day of
July A. D. 1919.

Section 13. Be it further ordained,
etc., that a tax of Three (3) mills on
the dollar of the assessed valuation be
and the same is hereby levied, assess-
ed and imposed upon all property
within the limits of Ward Number
Eight (8) of Jefferson Davis Parish
State of Louisiana, exclusive of in-
corporated towns in said Ward, sub-
ject to taxation, for the purpose of
making, grading, repairing and main-
taining dirt roads and bridges in said
Ward for the year 1921, pursuant to
the authority vested in this Police
Jury by virtue of a special election
held in said Ward on the 1st day of
July A. D. 1919.

Section 14. Be it further ordained,
etc., that a tax of Three (3) mills on
the dollar of the assessed valuation be
and the same is hereby levied, assess-
ed and imposed upon all the prop-
erty within the limits of Ward Num-
ber Nine (9) of Jefferson Davis Par-
ish, State of Louisiana, exclusive of in-
corporated towns in said Ward, sub-
ject to taxation for the purpose of
making, grading, repairing and main-
taining dirt roads and bridges within
said Ward for the year 1921, pursuant
to the authority vested in this Police
Jury by virtue of a special election
held in said Ward on the 1st day of
July, A. D. 1919.

Section 15. Be it further ordained,
etc., that the proper administrative

officers be and they are hereby
authorized and directed to spread and
levies as above set forth upon the
assessment rolls of the year 1921
to make the collection of the same
herein imposed according to the
etc., that this ordinance be and
be in force from and after its
adoption and promulgation.

Be it ordained by the Board of
Commissioners of Bell City Drainage
District No. One, that there be levied

ed valuation of all property incor-
porated in said district, subject to
