GEN. GRANT.

For a month past, the state of Gen. Grant's health has been bulletined to the country, by his doctors, and his death has been looked for, not only any day, but any hour. At the end of last week it was announced that Gen. Grant had walked down stairs, and taken a seat at the table in the dining room, where the family were at lunch.

When Gen. Grant was announced as dangerously ill, about the time the bill placing him on the retired list was before the last Congress, some skeptic hinted that his illness was exaggerated, to influence votes on that bill. This hint was considered an outrageous utterance, and was severely denounced, and Grant was reported as sinking slowly but surely, and the bulletins became more numerous. They described the state of his throat—how the cancer was progressing, and how it would soon eat into an artery and cause death by suffocation.

Then came the hypodermic injections of brandy, just in time to save him from death. It was stated that it was a useless struggle, that death was inevitable, but that it was desired to carry him through to the anniversary of the surrender of Gen. Lee, and the inference was, that he would then be permitted to die in peace. But just as every one had settled into the belief of his death, came the news of his improved health, which continued improving, until, at the end of last week, it was reported that, not only was Gen. Grant going to get well, but that he did not have cancer at all. Four doctors have been in attendance on Gen. Grant, and they appear to be divided in opinion, as to whether he has cancer or not.

Now this kind of a story may be all right, and then again, it may not. The aforementioned skeptic will probably be more set in his opinion than ever, and either he is right, and the illness was exaggerated, or the doctors don't know cancer when they see it. If it is a cancer, it is a most remarkable cancer. If it is not cancer, it is in order for the doctors to rise and explain.

FIRE IN VICKSBURG.

Tuesday night, Vicksburg was the scene of a disastrous fire, which destroyed an immense amount of property. The fire originated in The Famous Dry Goods store, and spread North and South. On the North it did not go very far being brought to a halt by that solid (in every sense of the word,) house of Lee Richardson & Co. The following houses were burned out: H. B. Bruser, hardware, Mrs. Bloom and The Famous, dry goods, Warner & Searles, clothiers, J. F. Baum & Co., music dealers and stationers, all on Washington St., then down Crawford street, A. A. Trecoff, agricultural implements, Joseph Podesta, liquor store, and a great many stores and buildings damaged by water and scorched wood. Lee Richardson & Co., lost largely by water in their main store, and had two warehouses with their contents burned, Gus Asher, druggist, was damaged by water. The insurance is said to be as follows:

Asher & Co., stock damaged, valued at \$8,000, insured for \$5,000. Warner & Searles loss \$48,000, insured for \$30,000. J. F. Baum on three buildings on Washington street, \$50,000, (according to Mr. R. F. Beck's estimate,) insurance \$26,000; loss on stock \$18,000, insurance, \$5,000. Robert Ernst, jeweler, stock valued at 7,000, insured for \$2,000; great portion of stock saved. Famous dry goods company, loss \$83,000, insurance \$58,000. Mrs. Rosa Bloom, loss \$15,000, insured for \$7,000. H. B. Bruser, loss \$35,000 on stock, insured for \$20,000; loss on frame building fully covered by \$1,000 insurance. A. A. Trecoff, loss on stock \$5,000, insured for \$3,000. Joseph Podesta, on Washington street building, loss \$12,000 insured for \$5,000; on Crawford street building, loss \$10,000, insured for \$2,500; on stock, loss \$20,000, insured for 10,000. R. F. Beck, building occupied by Mr. Asher, damages 500, no insurance. F. C. Wadsworth, stock occupied by Mrs. Bloom, loss 20,000; insurance 6,000. Telephone Company, losses \$3,000; insurance \$2,000. Commercial Herald, losses about \$250, covered by insurance.
