YOUR COTTON.

Peters, president of Cotton Growers' Association that he had received a well known southern firm, an offer to sell every bale of cotton

in Texas, Indian Territory and Oklahoma Territory. Inasmuch as the arrangements are not yet complete, Mr. Peters refused to divulge the name of the firm making the offer, but he declared that it was a thoroughly reliable and responsible banking institution of the south. The plan proposed is that the cotton shall be placed in the custody of trustees who will pay the money and see that the cotton is stored in a warehouse acceptable to insurance companies. The cotton is not to be sold until the owner is willing. Col. Peters stated that the details would be arranged this week and that at present the bankers were only figuring on whether the project would require \$12,500,000 or \$25,000,000.
