Moslems and Christianity.

A strong appeal has recently been made by a Mohammedan in Mecca, the Moslem "Holy of Holies," for a Christian missionary to be sent to that district.

Christian converts from Islam in Egypt are being subjected to a peculiarly subtle temptation in the form of bribes of government positions, with good salaries, on condition that they will abjure their faith in Christ. It is not, perhaps, surprising that some have yielded weakly to this temptation. Khutbas (Christian tracts written in the style of popular Moslem sermons) are being translated into Russian and other languages for distribution among Mohammedans that do not understand Arabic.
