SORE HEAD IN POULTRY

This disease is still so prevalent throughout the parish that requests have been made that the treatment and preventative measures be published again.

This disease does not originate except by contagion, and fowls do not have it more than once. It is, also, known as warts or chicken pox.

If fowls are in a healthy condition they are less apt to have this or any other disease than if they are not in prime condition. A good preventative measure is to give a teaspoon of epsom salts to each dozen birds twice a week. If the weather is dry, a teaspoon of flowers of sulphur may be alternated with the salts, giving each once a week.

After the disease appears give each bird three-fourths teaspoon of salts twice a week. The sores may be cured by the application of undiluted zinc oxide, creolin, tincture of iodine applied with a feather or a small brush. Mentholatum, menthol salve, or carbolated vaseline are also good. If any one wishes to take the trouble and time, it is better to remove the sores with one of the above oils or liquids, or warm water con-

taining some disinfectant, and then apply the remedy selected from the above list. Do not remove the scab but once. Almost any curative salve or liquid may be used, especially if it is of a caustic nature.

The premises should be thoroughly disinfected after the birds recover, so as to prevent a recurrence of the disease another season with any new birds which may have been raised or brought on the yard.

HIGH SCHOOL NOTES

Tallulah High School opened Monday September 15th with an enrollment of forty-nine in the high school department and one hundred and one in the first seven grades.

It will be noted that Algebra is not taught in the ninth grade this year. One year of Algebra is required which is given in the eighth grade. If the student wishes to take additional Algebra he may take it in the eleventh grade. The second year of Algebra is intended as a preparation for college work. Since this is true it is evident that the logical time to take it would be in the last of high school.

We are offering four courses in the high school this year. They are: Domestic Economy, Manual Training, Latin, and Commerce. All boys in the eighth and ninth grades are required to take Manual Training and the girls take Domestic Economy. In the tenth and eleventh grades the girls may take Latin, Domestic Economy, or Commerce and the boys may take either Latin or Commerce.

All beginners intending to enroll this term will enroll within two weeks from this date. No beginners will be admitted to the first grade after two weeks from now.

The high school schedule has been arranged that the students can prepare some of their work at school. This does not mean that it will not be necessary to study at home every night. The parents will please note this and assist in getting the students to prepare lessons. Why not assign each boy and girl in the high school department a certain time that they are to devote to home work and see that they go on no function or do anything else till the proper preparation is made? If you would like to know how much studying your boy or girl should do at home you may ask the principal and he will be glad to tell you. Please note the grades received on the report cards. If the grade is below seventy-five it means that he or she is not doing satisfactory work and that there is likely to be a failure at the end of the session. regard to this and do not wait till the end of the session and the student has failed to see if something cannot be done to avoid taking the same work next year.


