**TOWN COUNCIL PROCEEDINGS**  
Tallahulah, La., February 1, 1921  
Regular meeting of the Village Council held this date:  
Present: Mayor D. H. Allen Aldermen Geo. Spencer, W. J. Ward W. S. Craig and A. H. Hurd, Clerk.  
On motion of Mr. Ward reading of minutes of last meeting was dispensed with.  
The Mayor reported that he had been called on by a committee from the Tallulah Book Club and requested to take some steps towards having the old wreckage and dilapidated buildings removed from some of the lots in town, special attention being called to the unsanitary condition existing on a lot adjoining the jail, whereupon Mr. Craig offered the following resolution:

Resolved that the Mayor be requested to take up with Messrs McClellan and Sevier the question of demolishing the old stable building and of improving the unsanitary condition of their lot adjoining the jail lot; to ask the Estate of A. T. Lane to remove the old wreckage from their lot on the corner of Mulberry and Depot Sts., this being not only unsightly but dangerous to those passing on the sidewalk; to ask Mrs. Julia Loeb to remove the old building situated on her lot just west of the Bayou Bridge as this building is unfit for habitation; to ask Alice Barthelemy to have the remains of the burnt building removed from her lot on the corner of Walnut and Green Streets; and to notify Bettie Dixon that her pig-pen on her property adjoining the power house must be removed and the premises put in a proper sanitary condition.  
This resolution was seconded by Mr. Spencer and on being put to a vote was declared passed.  
On motion of Mr. Spencer the Mayor was authorized to employ a Street Commissioner who should also act as Peace Officer or Deputy Marshal; to purchase two mules and necessary equipment for working streets and to employ a helper to do this work.

Mr. Spencer offered the following Ordinance which was seconded by Mr. Craig. On being put to a vote all members voted in and the Ordinance was declared adopted:

**ORDINANCE NO. —**  
An Ordinance Establishing Fire Limits in the Village of Tallulah. **BE IT ORDAINED** by the Mayor and Board of Aldermen of the Village of Tallulah, that the said Village, availing itself of the provisions of Act No. 234 of the General Assembly of the State of Louisiana, as amended by Act No. 237 of 1920, does hereby establish a fire limit within the Village of Tallulah, Louisiana, which shall be enclosed within the following lines:  
Commencing where the North side of Depot Street intersects the Bayou Road on the East and extending thence Westerly the full length of said Depot Street, thence Northerly One Hundred and Fifty (150) feet, thence Easterly on a line parallel to the North line of Depot Street to the Bayou Road on the East, thence Southerly along the Bayou Road to the point of beginning; the intention herein being to establish fire limits which shall include the south half of all the blocks fronting Depot Street.  
Sec. 2. Be It Further Ordained, that hereafter it shall be unlawful for any owners of property within the above described limits to construct thereon frame buildings or to construct frame additions to the buildings already thereon.  
Sec. 3. Be It Further Ordained, that no buildings shall be constructed within the said fire limits above described unless the owner or builder thereof shall first obtain a building permit, in which shall be set forth the character of buildings hereafter to be constructed within such limits, in order that the Village may regulate and control the construction in such manner as to safeguard the Village against the spread of conflagration therein.  
There being no further business, on motion of Mr. Spencer and seconded by Mr. Ward meeting adjourned.
