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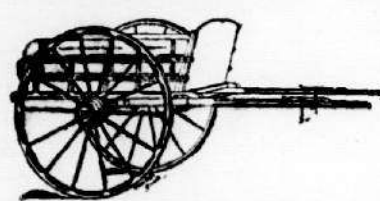

An Ordinance.
Whereas there is existing need that persons or firms conducting and operating establishments wherein live stock are slaughtered shall conduct and operate the same in a manner which will be conducive to the health and comfort of the public.
Be it ordained by the Police Jury of the Parish of Plaquemines, that hereafter any persons or firms engaged in this business shall dispose of all offals, entrails or other remnants of live stock slaughtered in any such establishment, by any means most convenient to said person or firm, provided the same shall not be deposited or placed in the open within three thousand (3,000) feet of any private residence or place of business.

Be it further ordained that any person or firm violating this ordinance shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor and upon conviction thereof, shall be sentenced by a court of competent jurisdiction to pay a fine not exceeding twenty-five (25) dollars, or to serve a term in the parish prison not exceeding thirty (30) days.
Be it further ordained, that all ordinances or parts thereof, in conflict with the provisions of this ordinance and the same are hereby repealed.

Proceedings of the Parish Board of School Directors.

Pointe-a-la-Hache, La., July 5, 1910.

Pursuant to call the Board of School Directors for Plaquemines Parish met this day in regular quarterly session. Present: Alex Brandt Jr., recently appointed as a member from the first ward, vice J. B. Rabington, resigned; Wm. Dymond, President, second ward; Jules B. Savoie, third ward; Meigs Childress, fifth ward; Louis Jeanfreau, sixth ward; Frank B. Giordano, seventh ward; Victor Treadaway, eighth ward; N. B. Cannon, ninth ward.

Director Alex Brandt Jr., presented his credentials as a member of the Board from the first ward and, on motion of Director Savoie, duly seconded, was sworn and seated.

On motion of Director Savoie, duly seconded, the minutes of the previous meeting were adopted as read.

On motion of Director Jeanfreau, duly seconded, the following report of the Superintendent was accepted:

Pointe-a-la-Hache, La., July 5, '10. To the Honorable the President and Members of the Board of School Directors for Plaquemines Parish:

Gentlemen:-I beg leave herewith to submit my report taking up only the repairs necessary to place the school in good condition for next session.

I recommend that only such repairs be made as are absolutely necessary and where a school house is not in good shape that thorough repairs be made so that the building will not need any repairs for two or three years.

The minor repairs should be made during the session and after the October and November taxes have been collected.

The following school houses are in need of repair: Lower Buras, Home-Place and Lower Pointe-a-la-Hache.

I would ask that the Board authorize the construction of a good fence around the grounds of the Courthouse school.
