Some people say it's no use to register and vote any more, because their votes have been counted out or stolen in the past. They imagine they will annoy the men who have done the stealing by refusing to vote again, but nothing could please these scoundrels more. If you have a horse stolen do you refuse to lock your stable after that so the thief can get them with trouble? When you refuse to vote against the thieves who robbed you, they get the offices without any trouble or exertion on their part; for if there are but three votes cast and they are cast for the thieves, they are elected. You are cutting off your nose to spite your face—you are acting childish and silly—you are tossing away lightly that great right of suffrage for which many of our ancestors spilled their life's blood—you are betraying your wife and your children whose destiny you have been intrusted with. The man who will not fight and die if necessary to preserve his ballot ought to be a slave, and he will be if he lives half a score of years longer.

Don't do it. Don't fail to register and vote. It costs you nothing now, but once it is lost, it will cost rivers of blood to regain it from the grasp of the monsters who are slowly squeezing all power from the hands of the people.

Who Can Vote in the Congressional Primary.

The recent action by the Democratic Executive Committee for this, the Fourth Congressional district, meets with the approval of all good party men, for it provides that all "known white Democrats" should be allowed to vote in the Democratic primary.

This simply means that all men who voted for Bryan at the last national election are eligible, for Bryanism is Democracy par excellence, and no man's party fidelity can be questioned who voted for him, provided he agrees to vote for the nominee selected at the coming primary.

We must congratulate the Democratic Committee upon thus opening the door of the Democratic wigwam, to all of our friends who may have strayed into the Populist camp, for all of them voted for Bryan; and if they agree to support the nominee of the Democratic party for Congress, no one can say nay, when they offer to vote. It is true that there are but very few Populists in Caddo, but many of the best men of the State have acted with that party in the past, and we are glad to know that the Executive Committee has left the door wide open for their return to the party of their first love. Any other policy would have divided the white people of Louisiana, and would have made Louisiana a doubtful State in the next presidential election, for with the white people divided, the Republicans by throwing their vote to either party, might carry the election, and the electoral vote of Louisiana might be lost to the Democratic presidential candidate at a time when it was necessary for the success of the national ticket.

Yes, any man who voted for Bryan, and who will agree to support the Democratic nominee for Congress, is just as good a Democrat as is needed in Louisiana, and the action of the Congressional Executive Committee will do much to again make the white people of this district a happy political family.

Some of the friends of some of the candidates for Congress are trying to construe the words "known Democrat" to exclude all Populists, but no man of common sense will say that any man who voted for Bryan is not as good a Democrat as the man who voted for Palmer and Buckner, in fact the Bryan man is the best Democrat of the two, but the way is open for both classes of repentant sinners to return, and we believe it was the intention of the committee to let both the Palmer bolter and the Bryan Populist to again return to the party and wash away their sins by becoming good, sound, swayback Democrats.—Shreveport Journal.


