Suppressed News from Washington.

(The New Time.)

Washington.—Senator Elkins, of West Virginia, one of the strongest believers in the annexation of the Philippine Islands, is in Washington. He came to the city just as soon as he heard of Spain's proposition for peace, and has been here ever since working in the interest of a strong and firm foreign policy. There are but few men in public life who have the confidence of the President to such an extent as Senator Elkins. With Mr. McKinley the West Virginian talked plainly and urged an open declaration that this country meant to hold the Philippines.

Before the war began Senator Elkins was opposed to hostilities. He thought the trouble with Spain could be settled by other means.

Without desiring to enter into a discussion of a colonial policy or an argument on territorial expansion. I desire to mildly criticize the President on the choice of friends. To those whose memories go beyond the present year an ill turn is given by reading that "few men in public life enjoy the confidence of the President to such an extent as Senator Elkins." This is the same Elkins, bear in mind, who would have looked on the world through bars at the end of the Star Route scandal if Justice and the penitentiary had their dues. If the President aims to retain the lofty reputation for virtue he has hitherto had, he will keep a stenographer in the room when Elkins is there. It may interest the readers of The New Time to be told the causes which have changed Elkins from his 'ante bellum' "peace at any price" position to his present aggressive war-loving fame. When woman and children were being starved in Cuba and after the assassination of the Maine battleship, with 250 odd of her men, Elkins sang, bird-like, for peace and for Spain. His interest, like Elkins' interest in everything, could be expressed in dollars and cents. He was the agent, the paid Senate representative, of the Spanish bondholders. He talked against war and earned his money. Elkins is honest, at least to the extent of doing what he is paid to perform. With war declared and hostilities on, Elkins' views point at once changed. It became his financial interest to prosecute the war thus entered upon. It is rudely estimated that Elkins, Bliss, the Secretary of the Interior, Hanna, the Senator from Ohio, and two others not in public life will directly reap fifty million dollars benefit from the war about to be concluded as this is written. Fully one-half of this fifty millions is contingent upon the retention of the Philippine Islands by this government. Mr. Elkins is one of the organizers and promoters of the Philippines Trading Company, recently formed. He is also deep into a scheme for building railroads in Cuba. A syndicate to own Poto Rico numbers Mr. Elkins among its members. He became busy as soon as war was declared, and at once secured a coal contract from the Government to furnish it 600,000 tons of coal for the navy at \$6.40 per ton. Senator Hanna, a person of some modesty as well as influence, could get a contract for the comparatively small amount of 400,000

tons—one million between them. The extortionate price paid is because of a clause which makes it necessary for the contractor to deliver coal at any naval station in the Atlantic. The figures were based on the Key West station, where the fleet then lay, and included a profit. The vessels that have required coal have all come north for it, or the fleet has been supplied by colliers, which invariably took their loads at Norfolk, the point most convenient to Elkins and Hanna's mines.

Elkins has quite supplanted Hanna in White House affections. He is a smoother proposition of manhood. Hanna bore himself to much as a guardian of the Presidential person as well as curator of the Presidential estate. Elkins is the sympathetic and interested friend.
