ALASKA'S BROWN BEARS.

They are Good Roadmakers and Furnish Dangerous Sport for Hunters.

"The brown bear is the great road-maker of the Alaska peninsula," said Hugh Mayo, a guide of many years' experience in that region. "Not only are the banks of the streams trodden into good trails by the huge, lumbering brutes, but the swampy plains are crossed in every direction by paths leading to the hills. The traveler will do well to follow them in journeying across the country, as they invariably lead to the best fording places of streams and form the easiest routes to the hills. The northern side of the Kenai peninsula, bordering the shores of Cook Inlet, Kaodiak Island and the Alaskan peninsula as far west as Uniak Island are favorite stamping grounds of the Alaska brown bear. He is a huge, shaggy animal, varying in length from six to twelve feet and weighing from 800 to 1,100 pounds. This bear possesses all the courage and fierceness of his southern cousin, the grizzly, and he has been hunted so little as yet that he is absolutely fearless of man and is an exceedingly dangerous adversary.

"In dealing with the Alaska brown bear a hunter should never go alone. A companion is almost as essential as a gun. If possible, a man well acquainted with the peculiar habits of this animal should be engaged to act as guide. Good bear dogs are of great assistance, but they must be brought into the country by the hunter, as there are very few dogs there. There are no trees as far west as Portage Bay, and the hunter must be exceedingly careful how he enters the heavy thickets which cover the river bottoms, as the bears favor this kind of ground, and if aroused or wounded, will unhesitatingly attack.

"Being an expert fisher, the bear frequents, during the salmon season, all the rivers emptying into the Behring Sea and the North Pacific and their tributaries as far as the fish go. After the salmon run is over the animal retreats into the recesses of the hills, where berries and small game are plentiful.

"The Alaska cranberry is an especially toothsome morsel to the brown bear, although the berry is not sweet, and the bear has a particularly sweet tooth. The Alaska cranberry grows on marshes that are 2,000 and even 5,000 feet above the sea level. When ripe they are almost a deep purple. They do not have seeds, like the New Jersey or Cape Cod cranberry, but have a stone, flat like the seed of a papaw and so hard that only the best steel blade will make a mark on it. Jelly made from these berries is of a rich claret color, and as transparent as the most flawless glass. The flavor of it is delicious. Bear hunters haunt these elevated marshes when the berries are ripe, for then they are sure of a profitable and easy bear harvest."—New York Sun.

RELICS OF GENERAL WASHINGTON

Articles Now Kept in the National Museum at the Capital.

One of the most interesting relics in the National Museum at Washington is the camp chest used by Washington throughout the revolution. It is a compact affair, about the size of a tourist's wicker chest for cooking of the present day, two and one-half feet long, two feet wide, one foot high, and it contains an outfit consisting of tinder-box, pepper and salt boxes, bottles, knives, forks, gridiron and plates. Every bit of the outfit save one bottle, which is broken at the shoulder, looks strong enough to stand another campaign.

Near-by are the tents used by Washington—three in number. One is a sleeping tent, twenty-eight feet long, with walls six feet high and a roof with a six-foot pitch. It is made of linen. The other two are marquee tents of smaller size, one with walls, the other a shelter tent open on the sides. That the tenting material of revolutionary days was good stuff is proved by the excellent condition of these tents, which sheltered the great commander through all his severe campaigns.

Here also is Washington's uniform, worn by him when he gave up his commission as commander-in-chief of the army, at Annapolis, in 1783. It consists of a blue shadbelly coat of blue broadcloth, lined and trimmed with soft buckskin and ornamented with broad, flat brass buttons; buckskin waistcoat and breeches. The size of the garments (which are in a state of excellent preservation) testify to the big stature of the "Father of His Country," and suggest that he had an eye to a fine appearance in his dress.—Washington Post.

A Natural Foghorn.

At the Farallones the erosive agents have worked with queer caprice. This rock being granite, has been acted upon by the sea at all levels, and throughout the long period when it has been rising out of the watery depths. Through a long, narrow hole, slanting, and communicating with the ocean, there comes at intervals a terrific stream of air, followed by the spasmodic heaving of the waves against the lower orifice. The government, which uses this island for lighthouse purposes, inclosed the upper end with the nozzle of a foghorn, and every few seconds there was blown an ear-splitting bawl, which was heard far out at sea, and above the din of the breaking rollers. It was allowed to roar only in foggy weather, but it was once in that it would only sound at high tide. When the tide was low, although the weather might be thick, the thing was silent. For lack of its warning, a ship went ashore upon the island rocks, and then it was that the government abandoned its location on the windhole and erected a steam siren, or mechanical foghorn, which has since very faithfully performed the necessary service.—From "Our Seaboard Islands on the Pacific," by John E. Bennett, in Harper's Magazine.
