

Police Jury.

Regular Meeting of the Police Jury of the Parish of St. Martin held January 6th 1890.

The meeting was called to order by Mr. Chs. Gaudin, who was appointed President Pro Tem, the President being absent.

The minutes of the last meeting were read and approved the Clerk reports that he has, as authorized, disposed of the Contract for keeping the Bridge at St. Martinville and that said contract was adjudicated to Mr. Chs. H. Vouthies for the sum of One Hundred Dollars a year.

Mr. St. Germain reports that as authorized he has disposed of the contract for keeping the Bridge at Breux Bridge and adjudicated said contract to Mr. Nicholas Blaise for the sum of Ninety nine dollars a year.

The Clerk was directed to spread the following letter to the President answering to the notice given to Mr. Peters Manager of the Key-stone Plantation as to removing obstructions in Bayou Teche at his place as per complaint from the Bayou Teche Packet Company.

To the Honorable Police Jury, St. Martin Parish Louisiana.

Gentlemen—I received your official notice of the statement made by the Bayou Teche Packet Company, with amazement and disgust, because we have not turned loose any coal barges this year, nor in former years, neither have we been guilty of placing obstructions of any kind in the bayou Teche to hinder navigation.

Three made different inquiry of Boatmen, inquiring when and what obstructions there are, to be complained of, and I am assured and satisfied that there are none whatever from St. Martinville down the bayou, until away down in Iberia parish, there is a sunken coal barge that does seriously obstruct navigation.

Hence, I submit, that it would have been eminently proper for the complaining representatives of the Bayou Teche Packet Company, to have first made the trip themselves through the Bayou, with a parish map along with them, before so kindly and pressingly inviting your Honorable Body, to take a ride on their boat, to see "such open and flagrant disregard of the rights of a community as has never been witnessed, where the condition of things is so dreadful that some remedy must applied soon, etc., etc., away down in Iberia parish."

The Clerk was directed to issue a check of \$27 in favor of the corporation of St. Martinville, being the one half of the amount paid by said corporation for crossing during the time new bridge was under construction.

The same parties as last year, to the exception of Taylor Green dead, were placed on the List of Paupers of the parish.

In conformity with Act No. 107 of 1888, and at the request of Mr. Valery Thibodeaux, the Parish was subdivided into four drainage Districts, and the commissioners appointed for each District, as follows:

1st. Ward, East of Bayou Teche.	Laurent Ducrest, Louis J. Bienville, Martin Ducrest.
2nd. Ward, West of Bayou Teche.	Clorfe Gauthier, Chs. S. Babin Jr., Numa Cormier.
3rd. Ward, East of Bayou Teche.	Doraine Castille, David Rees, Adre Thibodeaux.
4th. Ward, West of Bayou Teche.	Omer Martin, Jacques Delhomme, Onozime Thibodeaux.
5th. Ward, West of Bayou Teche.	Aladin Marks, Amerin Breux, Valdin Bernard.
6th. Ward, East of Bayou Teche.	Sotheone Zeringue, Amede Champagne, Jean Chadrville Melancon.

The 1st Ward was not acted upon by reason of the absence of the Police Juror of the Ward.

The 2d Ward was not subdivided, there being no necessity for the same as represented by the Police Juror of the Ward.

Mr. Pierre Arnaud was appointed Pond Keeper for the 5th Ward, East of Bayou Teche in place of Mr. Isaac Thibodeaux who has left the Ward.

Mr. Rousseau, Parish Treasurer called on the Police Jury and says that he is ready and disposed to settle with the Parish at any time.

On account of the absence of the President, caused by death in his family, both settlements with the Treasurer and the Sheriff, Tax Collector were postponed to next Meeting.

The Police Jury now proceeds to subdivide the parish into Road District and appoint Road Overseers thereto for the ensuing year, this in the following manner:

3rd Ward, East of Bayou Teche.

1st. Road District—From upper limit of the Corporation of St. Martinville to Catochoula lane included—Oscar Durand.

2nd. Road District—From lower line of Chretien Plantation to Lezin Lasseigne's upper line E. E. Vouthies, Overseer.

3rd. Road District—All the back portion of the 2nd District to Catochoula Lake—Chs. Broussard, Overseer.

4th. Road District—From Lezin Lasseigne's upper line to W. G. Ervin upper line—Victor Maradist, Overseer.

5th. Road District—From W. G. Ervin's upper line to Albert Broussard upper line, road following Teche—Dominique Dupuis, Overseer.

6th. Road District—All the back portion of the 5th District A. Maradist, Overseer.

3rd Ward, West of Bayou Teche.

7th. Road District—From lower line of Louis Duchamp's plantation to upper line of Louis C. Roy, Chs. Gauthier Overseer.

8th. Road District—From upper line of L. C. Roy to Sidney Moutons lower line—Gabriel Rolland, Overseer.

9th. Road District—From upper line of the 1st Ward to Fredricks Bridge included Paul Fourmet, Overseer.

10th. Road District—From Fredricks Bridge to Sidney Mouton plantation Edward Babin Overseer.

10th. Road District—From upper limits of the corporation of St. Martinville to lower line of L. C. Duchamp plantation Derneville Olivier, Overseer.

4th Ward, East of Bayou Teche.

1st. Road District—From Albert Broussard upper limits Andrew Thibodeaux, upper line Alfred Melancon, Overseer.

2nd. Road District—From Andrew Thibodeaux upper line to lower limit of the corporation of Breux Bridge, Joseph Pollerin, Overseer.

3rd. Road District—From the corporation of Breux Bridge through Chs. Rees lane to Arcade Patin, Bob Patin, Overseer.

4th. Road District—From upper limits of the corporation of Breux Bridge to upper line of Mr. F. Broussard, Clement Broussard, Overseer.

5th. Road District—From Andrew Thibodeaux upper line, back of the 49 arpent to Chs. Rees, lane Klempert Rollier.
