D. 1904, and for each subsequent year, upon e person, association of persons, or bu ness firms doing and persuing the bu ness of barroom, cabaret, coffee-ho coffee, beer saloon, liquor exchange, drinking saloon, grogabop, beer house, beer garden, or other place where any-thing to be drunk is sold directly or indirectly within the Corporate limits of the Town of St. Martinville, La.

Be it further ordained, etc., that this ordinance shall go into effect on Janua ry 1st 1904.


