The Improvement of the Teche.

Representatives Broussard and others from Louisiana are making every effort to secure large appropriations for the improvement of the water ways of Lonisiana, and he following bit of news concernfrom the news sent out from Wash. ington last Saturday, will be of some interest to our people, it follows:"
"Improving Bayou Teche, La., with a view of obtainivg a six.foot navigation :to Arnaadville, in accordance with the report submitted in House document 52 i, firat sessiou. Fifty-ninth Congress, and for mainteuance, 8118,500 ; pruvided that this expeuditure for six foot pavigation to Arnaudville shall be coutingent upon all lands uecessary for lock and dam purposes and canal feeders being ceded to the United States free of cost, and upon the United States being secured agaiust possibie claims for damages resulting from overflow of lauds by reason of lock aud dam improvement, or from drainíug of Spanish Lake.
The opening for navigation of the Teche to Araandvilie by Iredging a six foot ebannel all the way through, would make the Teche one of the most important streams in the state.
Now if Coulee Pointe Clair could be dredged and made to connect with the Teche and also Bayon Portage just above Breaux Bridge, this would throw the whole of the swamp trade and the vast lamber industries of the Cypress swamps in easy rench of the Teche conntry, and this alcne would be worth millions of doliars, as the facilities would such be that saw mills and many other wood indastries could be located ou the Teche or even in the swamps and their product bronght to market withoat loog and dangerous routes through th large lakes.
Such improvements would be of such great benefit to the Teche country, that our people can hardly renlized of what maguitude

## would be.

Let us hope that all these pro jeets will soon be realized.

## Murder Case,

A Morgan City special to The Times. Democrat dated January 18th says:
"As the result of a family quarrel a sad tragedy was enacterl at Cypress Island yesterday. The coroner's inquest held by Dr. Tarleton bere to-day brought out the ollowing evidence:
Mrs. Spangler lives at Cbicot Pasb, iu St. Martin Parish, with one of her sons, who keeps the goverment light at the pass, and yesterday came down Graud Lake abont ten miles to Cypress Island, where her sou and a danghter, Mre. Puckett, live, to collect $\$ 10$ which she said
Puckett.
The two women became involved in a quarrel and Mrs. Puckett truck ber wother over the head with an irou poker, inflictiug a se vere wound. She then secured a batchet aud drove her mother ont ot the bouse. The old woman went to the dwelling of her son, a short distance awny, and told ber nephew about her treatment. Se curing his gau, Fred Spangler, nc curing his gou, Fred Sy his younger broth er, Eddie, went to the Pucket house. The Pucketts, husbaud and wife, met them at the door and a general shootivg took place, Fred Spangler being shot in the breast and back of the head by Puckett and Eddie Spaugler in both feet by Mrs. Puckett.
The two Spaugler boys were brought to Morgan City at once in a gas boat, Fred dying on the way. Eddie is not dangerously hurt. It is said that Puckett tas gone to St. Martinville to surren der.
On hearing of the murder Deputy Sheriff Victor Maraist left for the scene of the shooting, but learned the Pucketts, man and wife were at Franklin on their way here to surreader and returaed with the prisoners Saturday afternoon and placed them in the parish jail to await the action of the Grand Jury which will probably meet next March at the next criminal term of the District Court. This case, like all the others that came from the distant swamps, will prove a very expensive one for the parish as all the witnesse will have to travel many miles to attend court.
