CHARTER.

Be it known that on this 16th day of the month of March A. D. 1909;

Before me, James J. Martin, a Notary Public, duly commissioned and qualified in and for the Parish of St. Martin, State of Louisiana, and in the presence of the witnesses hereinafter named and undersigned:

Personally and appearcame the persons whose are hereunto subscribed, who verally declared that availing themselves of the State Law creating Limited Corporations, they do now organize themselves into a Limited Corporation for the objects hereinafter stipulated, which they declare to adopt as their CHARTER, viz:

ARTICLE I.

The name of this Corporation shall be the LEVERT MERCANTILE COMPANY LIMITED, with domicile at St. Martin Parish, State of Louisiana.
